Annual Session of Canadian Grand Lodge.

MEETING IN TORONTO

Mr. George Irving of Vernon River Bridge Provincial Delegate.

Mr. Geo. Irving of Vernon River Bridge leaves by the western train this morning as a delegate from the Grand Lodge of P. E. Island to the sixty sixth annual session of the Grand Lodge of Canada, (Ontario) Independent Order of Good Templars, which will be held in Toronto on Wednesday, June 28th.

The International Supreme Lodge, I. O. G. T. meets in Toronto, also, on Tuesday, June 27th. This will be a gathering of representatives from all parts of the world. Delegates will be present from Great Britain, Switzerland, Germany, Norway, Sweden, and other European countries, from South Africa, New South Wales, New Zealand, and from the United States and Canada.

On Tuesday evening, June 27th, a public reception will be given the International Supreme Lodge, in the Pavilion, at the Horticultural Gardens, at which representatives of the city, and provincial governments, and churches, will welcome the friends, from other lands.

On Wednesday evening, June 28th, a reception will be given the International Supreme Lodge by the Grand Lodge, and kindred Temperance Societies, in the Auditorium of the Normal School Buildings.

On Thursday evening, June 29th, the city will give all delegates to the International Supreme Lodge and the Grand Lodge, a free moonlight excursion on the lake.

On Sunday, July 2nd, at 3 o'clock, p. m., a monster Gospel Temperance meeting will be held in the Pavilion, at the Horticultural Gardens, which will be addressed by some of the most prominent temperance speakers of the world.
