### SCRIBE'S REPORT TO MARCH 31ST

Of Victoria Division No 4 - One of the Most Prosperous Periods—New Members.

Another quarter has closed in the history of Victoria Division No 4 and it is the duty and pleasure of the officers and members to record what has been one of the most prosperous periods the Division has known since its organization nearly 58 years ago. The enthusiasm in the cause of Prohibition has been very marked among all classes in P. E. Island during the last few months. A renewed interest has been taken in the work, and the splendid results of the election in Prince County when so handsome a majority was rolled up for Prohibition, has acted as such an encouragement to all friends of and workers in the cause that a determined agitation, has been set on foot for the repeal of the Scott Act and the enforcement of the Prohibition law in the counties of Queens and Kings. The petitions for elections in these counties have received for more than the necessary number of signatures, and there is good reason for the hopes that the elections will follow no distant date.

One of the many results of this renewed, awakening in the cause of Prohibition has been the initiation into the Divisions of the Sons of Temperance of a large number of men and women both young and old all over the Province. Victoria Division has shared largely in this influx to the Order and has received such an accession to its ranks as has placed it on what is perhaps a better footing than it has held at any time in its history.

During the quarter ending with the month of March there were 38 proposals for membership ready before the Division. Of this number of applicants 24 were duly initiated, 21 being new members of the Order, while 3 were admitted by card from other Divisions. Of the remainder, a number have announced their intention of coming up for initiation at an early date. The number of withdrawals during the quarter has been but two, the causes of both being the inability of the members owing to other appointments to attend on the regular night of meeting. One of these has however joined another Division and is therefore still by member of the Order.

The Division has since the beginning of the year been favored with two fraternal visits from other branches of the Order. On the evening of February 13th a number of the members of 20th Century of York, including Rev. Mr. Dawson and wife paid us a visit. An excellent program was rendered by the visiting members, consisting of reading vocal and instrumental music, and some well chosen remarks from Mr. Dawson. Refreshments were served by the members of Victoria Division and a pleasant evening spent by all. On February 28th the Division entertained the members of Elliot of Rocky Point, this being the occasion of another pleasant fraternal meeting.

The meetings have been well attended during the quarter and the seating capacity of the Division room has been tested to such an extent to accommodate the numbers present that an agitation has been set on foot for the removal of the place of meeting to larger and more commodious quarters. A good program has been rendered on each night of meeting, or large number of the members and especially the ladies taking an active part, a new feature in the way of entertainment introduced last quarter being the setting report of one evening for each of the three nationalities, English,

#### A CASE OF TUBERCULOSIS.

SIR—The case which Mr Justice Fitzgerald called attention to a few days ago, is similar to one we have here. And I have no doubt there are many more throughout the Province.

This young man is afflicted with tuberculosis. He has no home. His disease is probably too advanced for him to be admitted into a Sanatorium. The community has moved in the matter, and a high minded Christian family has furnished him with a home so far.

I wish to call attention to this case in order to emphasize the fact that we should have some place to receive a person so situated. And when we consider the very great prevalence of tuberculosis in this Province, it is imperative that we have a place where consumptives are properly treated.

Now, I do not see why one could not be built at the Experimental Farm. It is near the Hospital for the insane, and the Doctor in charge of that institution if he has the time to spare, could, for an extra consideration, look after both places.

If this could be done it would lessen the cost of and the expenses of running a Sanatorium very considerably. Anyway it is not so much a question of cost as it is of humanity, and the Government should take up this question at once.
