The schedule for the increased pay of machinists, car men, maintenance of way, office men, and others on the Intercolonial Railway has been approved by the Deputy Minister of Railways. It practically includes all except the trainmen, who are now the highest paid on this continent. The new schedule takes effect from April 1 and the increased pay will be given out in the May envelopes. About \$150,000 will be distributed in this way.

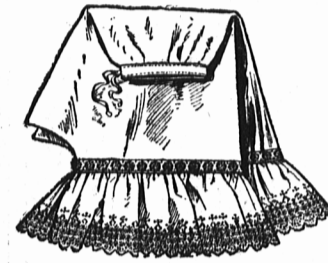

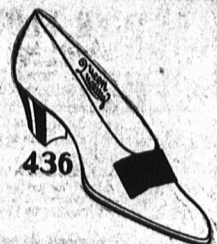
