## LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Aug. 12—(CP)—There were 93 cattle, 81 sheep and lambs, 858 hogs and 904 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today.

Cattle and hogs were steady. Lambs were steady to 25 cents higher, calves 25 to 50 cents higher. The cattle offered were mostly cows and bulls. Butcher cows were \$4.75 to \$7. Good cows \$6.50 up, and medium cows \$5.50 to \$6.25. Canners and cutters \$3.50 to \$4.50. Common bulls \$4.50 to \$6.75 mostly \$5 to \$5.50.

Real calves were around 50 cents higher, selling \$8.50 to \$12. Good veals were \$11 to \$11.50 with one calf at \$12. Drinkers were \$6.50 to \$8 and grassers \$5 to \$6.50, averaging around \$6.

Good ewes and wethers were \$11 to \$11.50. Buck lambs and culls were cut \$1 and \$2 per cwt respectively. Sheep were \$3.50 to \$6.50.

Hogs were firm at \$14.75 for B-1 dressed, with one small sale at \$15 and \$11.10 for B-1 alive fed and watered. And up to \$11.25 off trucks delivered. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$7.50 to \$9.25.

## Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Aug. 12—(CP)—The picture on the stock exchange today was a study in lights and shades, mostly shades.

Some strength appeared in the utility section, where Bell Telephone picked up a point and Brazillian was fractionally harder. Shawinigan moved back a trifle.

Losses up to a point were registered in industrials, Dominion Bridge topping the list of losers. Others weaker were Canada Cement, Canadian Car, General Steel Wares and Hamilton Bridge. Asbestos and Enamel and Heating moved against the general trend.

Mines were pointed downward, Hudson Bay Mining and International Nickel both giving ground, while, in newspapers, St. Lawrence Corporation common and "A" were also softer.

McCull Frontenac firmed fractionally, in oils, but C.P.R. was off slightly, in rails, Canada Steamship preferred recovered an early deficit, in carriers.

Slips were general among miscellaneous issues boarded, Zellers dropping slightly and Imperial Tobacco and National Breweries lesser amounts. Lake of the Woods was an exception and posted an advance.

Total sales: 15,300 shares; Industrials, 4,700; Mines, 10,600; Bonds, \$5,000.

## Finance

NEW YORK, Aug. 12—(AP)—Foreign news and doubts and fears aroused by Washington steps to lighten the nation's economic belt kept the stock market in a pessimistic mood today.

Canadian stocks ranged generally unchanged to fractionally lower. Dealers Seagram lost 1-2, Walkers 1-8 and Imperial Oil 1-4. Unchanged were Dome, International Nickel, Brazilian Traction and Lake Shore Mines.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite ended 1 of a point down. It was the seventh decline since July 28 and in this interval there has been no advance. Thus, from the standpoint of the bulls it has been one of the longest droughts in recent stock market history. Dealings totalled 427,300 shares against yesterday's 447,300. It was the quietest session since July 18. Yielding fractions to around 2
