Miss Lillian and Master Mont McIntyre of Charlottetown are visiting in Montague and New Perth.

The following are the Souris market prices: Oats per bus, thirty cents, potatoes, new per bushel, 50 cents; hay per ton, 10 dollars; butter per pound, 22 cents; eggs, per dozen, 15 cents; beef, per pound, 63 cents.

In Montague yesterday dealers were paying forty two cents a bus for oats; fifty cents a bus for potatoes; seventeen cents a doz for eggs; eight to ten dollars a ton for hay; eighteen to twenty cents a lb for butter; and eight to nine cents a lb for hides.
