PREMIER PARENT WILL NOT RETIRE

Thirty Men Narrowly Escaped Drowning Near Delaware Breakwater—Boat was Caught in Ice and Filled Suddenly and Without Warning.

Lewis, Del., Feb. 7.—Thirty men narrowly escaped drowning in the icy waters of the harbor of Refuge at the Delaware Breakwater, and after being rescued with the greatest difficulty by the crews of two tugs, were forced to make their way to shore afoot over the heavy ice floes with which the Delaware river and bay are blocked.

SPECULATION ON THE AWARD

French Papers Think Russians Have Won Case—Some Opinion on the Case.

PARIS, Feb. 8. The close of the testimony before the international commission inquiring into the North Sea incident has been followed by a rather noticeable diminution of the confidence in British circles connected with the case and corresponding elation on the part of the Russians. The French Press which is strongly pro-Russian gives marked prominence to statements that the Russians have virtually won their case.

RUSSIANS BEGIN EXTENSIVE MOVE

of Cavalry Against Field Marshal Oyama— Russian Artillery Destroy Houses etc.— Cavalry Crossing the Hun River in Large Numbers.

ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 15.—(Special)—Last night they were attempting to cross the Hun River west of Lia Yang with nine thousand horsemen. The operation began west of Chitaizui and one force of cavalry stole into Lao Hum Shi and simultaneously another cavalry force approached Tacha which is thirteen miles south west of Chitaizui.

A WOMAN WAS CHOKED TO DEATH

Strangled by a Strange Man Near Her Home—Her Body Was Discovered in an Alley where the Murder Was Committed.

PITTSBURG, Feb. 8.—The dead body of Mrs. John A. Kirkpatrick was found in the back yard of an unoccupied house in Allegheny, only a short distance from her home. She had been murdered, and the morgue physician tonight stated that the woman had been criminally assaulted. Suspicion rests on a man as yet unknown to the police, but who evidently was an acquaintance of the woman.
