AT MONCTON.

MONCTON, July 12.—The glorious 12th was befittingly celebrated by the county Orangemen at Sackville to-day. Lodges from different parts of the county were present and a right royal time was had.

A FAIRLY well attended meeting of those interested in the proposed Pork Packing Establishment in Summerside, was held in Market Hall yesterday afternoon. Mr A C Rogers, president of the board of directors occupied the chair. The secretary Mr John M Clarke, explained the step taken by the directors since the last meeting and read some correspondence received relative to the cost of the necessary building and equipment. From a reliable Chicago house he had obtained plans and estimates putting cost of machinery, ice plant and building at \$28,000. This would equip an establishment with a capacity of 300 to 500 hogs per day. The ice plant was estimated at \$9000, from which the directors considered could be greatly reduced. In reference to the scheme proposed at former meetings Mr Clark said the directors were of the opinion that the co-operative system was impracticable and that in a canvass among farmers it was found that the joint stock idea was preferred. The relative advantages of these two systems was fully discussed by Messrs Jss Carruthers, W K Mackay, Mr Praught, Lot 16, Charles Craig, Middleton, Ephraim Bell, Cape Traverse, D H Macdonald, Bedeque; Walter Simpson, Cavendish, Martin Connick, Kensington, and others. All expressed a desire to see the project carried out and while some were anxious to proceed on either bases, the majority favored the Joint Stock plan, as the only practicable one. The following resolution was moved by Mr D H McDonald and seconded by Mr Martin Connick, and unanimously carried: Whereas it has been found impracticable by the directors to proceed with the proposed co-operative plan. Therefore resolved that this meeting is of the opinion that a joint stock company be formed and would instruct the directors to prepare a proposition for the same to be submitted at a future meeting to be held not later than January 1st next. The directors were also authorized to invite Mr Packnam, who is interested in one or two factories in the Maritime Provinces, to address a meeting here at some convenient date in the near future.
