1 cup whites
1/2 teaspoonful of salt

1/2 cup of milk (approximately)

POTATO CASSEROLE

Slice eight cold, boiled, potatoes. Fry 2 small onions, thinly sliced, in 3 tablespoons butter until a light brown, add 2 tablespoons flour, and cook until frothy.

POTATO AND CARROT SOUP

4 medium-sized carrots
1 small onion
4 medium-sized potatoes
1/2 cup of stewed tomatoes, Pepper
3 stalks of celery or celery tops
1 quart milk
Salt
