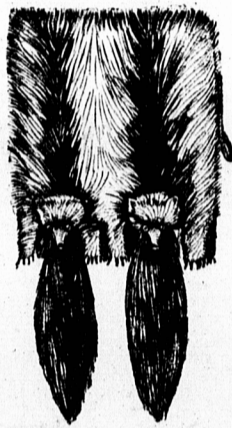

## QUEEN ALEXANDRA ALMOST DEAF

LONDON, Nov. 8.—Queen Alexandra is now almost entirely deaf. Although during the London season she had been treated for deafness by a skillful specialist, and her hearing had greatly improved, she has lost all the benefits thus acquired by going to Balmoral, where the keen Highland air gave her neuralgia. Conversation with the Queen is sometimes hopeless being very sensitive about it, she will keep on talking at cross-purposes rather than explain that she is deaf. This painful trait once induced the King of Spain to remark to his wife that Queen Alexandra was really very dull. Queen Ena retorted: "So would you be if for many years you had never heard more than half a sentence, and were always wondering what the rest was about!"

## ST. JOHN MAN IN TROUBLE

MONCTON, Nov. 8.—Cecil Irving, formerly of St. John, but recently in the employ of the Times Printing Co., was arrested last night, and this morning brought before the police magistrate charged with theft of a file of papers from the Times office, the papers being the result of canvassing done by him while in their employ. Irving had been in Moncton three months and was two weeks ago discharged from the Times employ. In court this morning he pleaded to be tried by a jury. The case was adjourned until tomorrow morning.

## TO SAVE LIFE CUTS TELEGRAPH LINE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—"This is an unusual occurrence, one for which the offender should not be punished, because he was simply fighting to save his own life." This was the recommendation made by First Lieutenant Charles L. Willard, U. S. A., in charge of the fourth section of the Alaska military telegraph line, in reporting a break of the line to Brigadier General James Allen, chief signal officer of the army. The break of the line occurred at half past three o'clock on the afternoon of September 1, between Old Woman and Callag, a district described as the most bleak of all Alaska. The break was found the following day at twenty minutes past two o'clock, and at that point lay a traveler following the portage trail. He was without food, partly paralyzed and unable to go further. With his remaining strength he cut the telegraph line, knowing that he would immediately bring the repair men and save his life. The traveler's name was not given in the official report. The tragedy of the official report touched the heart of the chief signal officer.

## QUICK JUSTICE FOR THIS ITALIAN ON MURDER CHARGE

WOODSTOCK, Ont., November 8.—Quick justice followed Michael P. Onsie, an Italian, who in a quarrel over a game of "hazard," near Ingersoll last Sunday, slew his companion, named Constantine, by striking him down with a stone. Onsie escaped, but was captured the next day and brought to Woodstock and placed on trial yesterday on the charge of murder. Yesterday the jury found him guilty of manslaughter and he was taken to jail to await sentence later in the session.

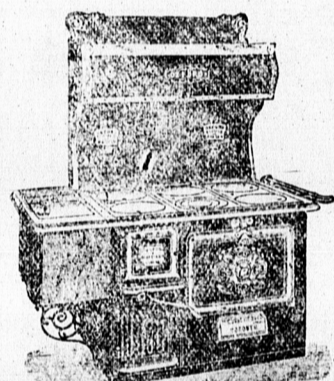

## REACHES SYDNEY ON ALL 'RED' MISSION

OTTAWA, Ont., Nov. 8.—A cable message has been received here from Dr. R. M. Coulter, C. M. G., the deputy postmaster general, announcing his arrival at Sydney, N. S. W. He will at once commence his negotiations with the commonwealth government at Melbourne in regard to the position which Australia is likely to assume towards the All-Red line project.

After his conference at Melbourne, Dr. Coulter will go to Wellington, New Zealand, and will afterwards proceed to South Africa and Great Britain. He is not likely to be back in Ottawa until March at the earliest.
