Demand Strong At Fur Auction

MONTREAL, Sept. 14.—(By The Canadian Press)—Demand was strong for furs here today. In summing up the results of the auction for the past two days it was found that 50 per cent of the entire offerings were sold for \$300,000.
Red fox pelts were outstanding in demand, with 92 per cent of the offerings of 2,775 pelts disposed of. A general advance in price of 20 per cent over the previous sale schedules. Beavers, minks and martens were strong favorites with the large gathering of foreign and domestic buyers.
As compared with the June sale, however, was unchanged, 87 per cent of the offerings sold, top price, extra large darks, \$10. In the lot were 8,220 skins, mink, mixed collection, with a top price for fine darks of \$28.
Lynx and lynx cats remained unchanged. Offers advanced five per cent, with the best lot of extra darks bringing \$22.50. Marten advanced 10 per cent, with 1,040 skins offered and 92 per cent of the offerings sold. Red fox advanced 20 per cent and was in very good demand with 92 per cent sold. Cross fox remained unchanged.

Expansion Is Shown In Fall Trade Survey

MONTREAL, Sept. 14.—Plans for fall trade continue to expand, as reports from the leading provinces are more uniform in their expressions of continued gain in confidence, which are being accompanied by larger orders than was the case a year ago for many items of merchandise. Wholesale trade has picked up markedly during the last two weeks, and delivery reveals the paucity of retailers' stocks.

Crowded Jungle's Life

Just how crowded with animal life is the jungle of tropical lands is scarcely appreciated by those who have not seen it. William Beebe, an English naturalist, has been at pains to make a minute survey of a quarter of a square mile of land at Kartoba, in British Guiana, with the result of uncovering an amazing quantity and variety of life. He found 73 different kinds of mammals, 464 of birds, 93 of reptiles, 37 of amphibians and 150 of fishes. And, besides these, there were hundreds of spiders and scorpions, various snails and slugs, a perplexing mob of "worms" of high and low degree and so on down to simple creatures like fresh water sponges in the rivers.

LONDON, Sept. 14.—The eyes of Methodists the world over will be upon the Albert Hall on Sept. 20. After a century of separation the Wesleyan Methodists, the Primitive Methodists and the United Methodist Church will then be formally reunited in one church. The King will be represented at the Albert Hall by the Duke of York, who will be accompanied by the Duchess. The High Commissioners of the Dominions, and ambassadors from all countries where Methodism is active will attend. Most Rev. William Temple, Archbishop of York, Rt. Rev. A. F. Winnington-Ingram, Bishop of London and Rt. Rev. G. Nickson, Bishop of Bristol, will represent the Anglican body. The Presbyterian Church, the friends, the Salvation Army, and practically every other denomination in these islands, except the Catholic Church will also send representatives.
