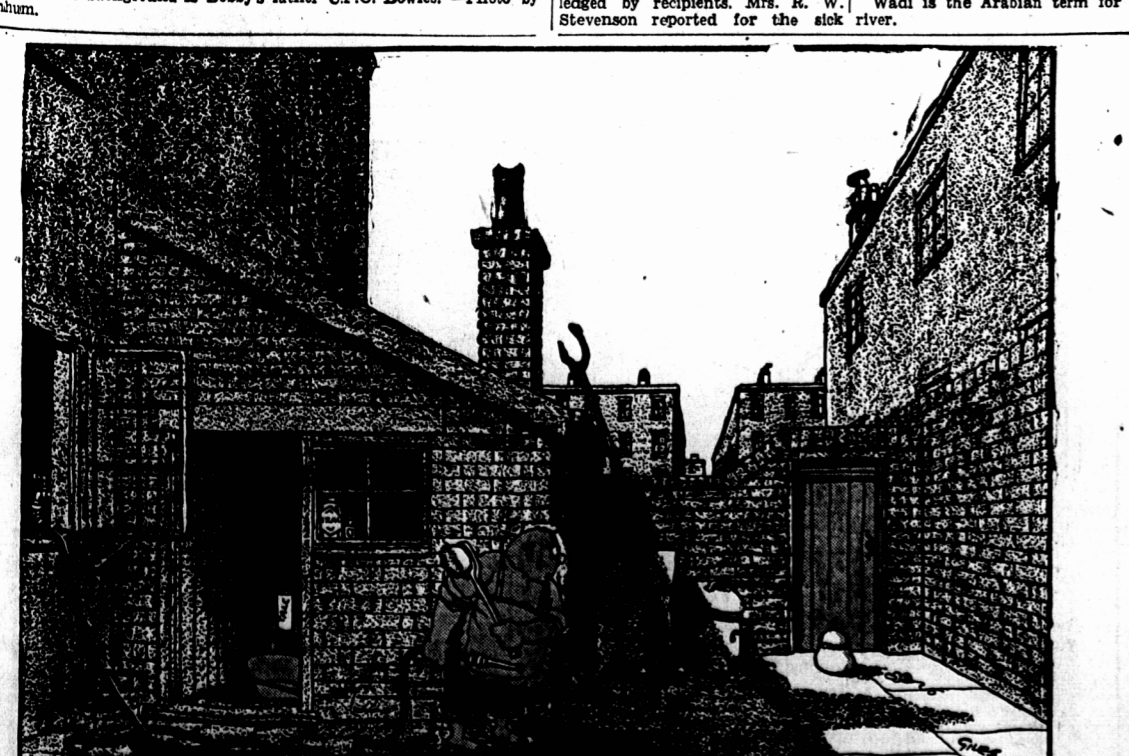
Island Group On Extended Trip To Western Canada

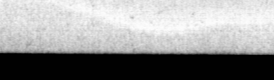

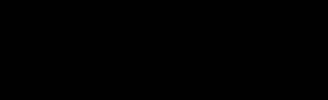

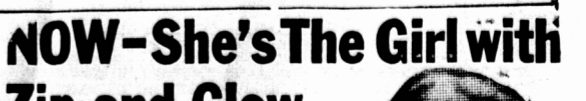
