



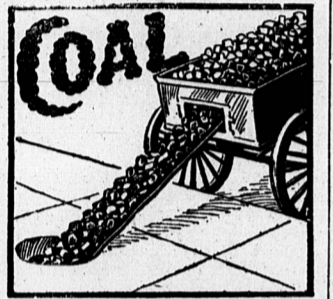

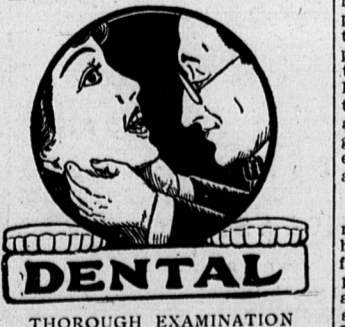

Lewis W. Brewster, late Editor of the Portsmouth (N. H.) Journal is now in Charlottetown on his return from the Magdalen and St. Pierre.

Miss Gladys Boreham stenographer in the Customs Department, Halifax has returned after spending a holiday in this city. While here she was the guest of Mrs. Wm. Crockett, Fitzroy street.

The Executive of the Teachers Association are to be congratulated on having secured so eminent an Educationalist as Hon. Payson Smith of Maine to deliver two addresses at their Convention next week.

Weather permitting there will be a tournament of gentlemen's single Saturday afternoon at the courts of the lawn tennis club, drawing to start at 2.30 sharp. A photograph of the members of the club will be taken at five p. m.

The Manchester Shipper arrived in port Monday morning, and sailed a gain at 4 o'clock direct for Manchester with a quantity of hay shipped by Capt. Joseph Read and R. E. Mutch, also one hundred and twenty-five sheep and twenty head of cattle by E. Wheatley & Co. She had two passengers, Mrs. Parks and daughter, who had been visiting Andrew and Mrs. McNair of this city.

Yesterday morning a large plate glass in a building belonging to Mr. Morgan, Queen st, was driven in by a fist. Four other panes in August Herman's window received similar treatment. An arrest is likely to ensue as a result. William Power was alleged to be the culprit and a warrant was prepared for his arrest. At 4.40 p. m. three officers learned of his whereabouts and proceeded to Capt. Hughes on Water Street. Here a large crowd witnessed the apprehension of Power who was lodged in the police station.

W. J. Palmer, of the Agricultural Department of the Union of South Africa, is in Canada buying cattle for the Land Settlement Department of the Orange River Colony. Mr. Palmer, who is a native of Prince Edward Island, and a graduate of the Ontario Agricultural College, has been nearly eight years in South Africa. While he finds our prices here higher than he would have to pay in Holland, these are offset by the cheaper freight rates from Canada. Our cattle are greater on performance than they are on robustness.

There are, of course, many of his people going in for pure breeds, and Mr. Palmer predicts that South Africa should be a coming market for our good stuff. Among those who have sold to Mr. Palmer were A. E. Hulet, and Haley Bros., of Norwich, Ont., and Stanley Logan, of Amherst, N. S. Mr. Palmer finds great progress here since he left Canada. Calling on W. A. Dryden of Brookline Ont., he found Mr. Dryden in connection with the outside world by the Bell Telephone and the People's Telephone. Within an hour they had prices on every available Short-horn bull within fifty miles, and getting into a motor car (another innovation for the farmer since Mr. Palmer's time), a dozen fine bulls were secured within another two hours. Merino sheep-raising is the chief industry, cattle next, then horses, making remounts for the British army a probable certainty. Growing Indian corn has proved profitable by increased overseas markets, and by specially low rates given by railway and ocean transportation companies. Ostrich farming and Angora goat raising, the latter for mohair, are profitable specialties. The co-operative creamery is being followed by pork factories, which should make them figure in the world's markets. British South Africa spends between three and four millions dollars annually on agriculture, part of which goes to stamping out animal diseases—quite a contrast to what Canada spends.—Exc.

A telegram received in this city yesterday announced the death in St. Louis, Mo., of James Miller Sutherland, formerly of this city. No additional particulars were received. The deceased was a son of John S. and Marion Miller Sutherland, Park Corner, who emigrated from Scotland in 1844. Mr Sutherland was born on June 30, 1853, being fifty eight years of age. He received his early education in the public schools and Prince of Wales College. He then took up the study of law and was called to the Bar here in 1877. He was a partner of Sir Louis H. Davies and a member of the local Assembly. He married a Miss Henderson of this city. For the past twenty years he has been located in St. Louis where he established a lucrative law practice and was estimated as an attorney well up in his profession.
A South Framingham exchange has the following:—"The sympathy of the community goes out today to H. and Mrs. Parker, 8 Arlington street, in their bereavement caused by the death, after only a few hours illness yesterday, of their little daughter, Alice Winsloe, a beautiful child, who would have been two years and three months of age on Sept. 22. The child, who had always enjoyed the best of health, first appeared ill Thursday morning, after a restless sleep during the night, and a physician was called. At 11 a. m. the little patient appeared much improved but during the afternoon her condition grew serious and her death occurred about 3 o'clock from gastroenteritis causing deep gloom over a household which was preparing to occupy a new residence now nearing completion on Oliver street. The funeral is to be held at the house at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon. The Rev. Harold C. Feast, formerly of Hamilton, Ont., pastor of Grace Congregational church, will officiate and interment will be in the family lot in Lake Grove cemetery at Holliston.
