**Losses Held Substantial Advantages Over Gains**  
MONTREAL, Oct. 17—(CP)—Papers in the face of profit realization after their recent rally, moved down in transactions today on the stock exchange and curb market for the second day. Industrials were down on balance. In the over-all picture, losses held a substantial advantage over gains at the bell.  
Losing fractions to 2 1-2 points in papers were Fraser, Price, M. & O., Abitibi Common and Preferred, International, St. Lawrence Common and "A", Brown, Dryden and B. C. Forest. Consolidated and Donnascon converted increases into losses. St. Lawrence Paper, which opened lower, and Eddy were up.  
Among the harder issues in industrials were Vickers, which jumped 12 as a reaction to reports the management has completed its plans for the reorganization of the company's financial structure. Cement Common and Preferred, Cockshutt, C. Surar, Foundries, Electrolux, Ontario Steel, Algoma and General Steel Wares. Esler were Doce, E. Steel, Marsani, Ford, Hamilton Bridge United Steel, C. Locomotive, Massey and Asbestos, Celanese and Dominion Textile sagged in their section. In liquors, Walker and Ricks pushed up and Canadian National Breweries, Melcher and "A" and Beagrams were off. Power Corporation and Winnipeg Electric firmed in utilities. Bell was better off for a time and softer were Catiens and Brazil, which had a firmer start. Shawinigan, Quebec Power, Montreal Power B. C. Power "A" and Ottawa Electric. Royal advanced in banks and Montreal recovered from a stumble. Provincial transport improved and C.P.R. and steamship fell back in carriers. Aluminum, nickel and Noranda peaked up in metals and smelters.
