Noted Norwegian Comes To America

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—Charles Hoff, the Norwegian pole vaulting and middle distance star who recently vaulted 13 feet 2 1/4 inches in France, has announced that he will invade America during the coming winter, probably making his first appearance in the Millrose (Mass) Athletic Association indoor games which are to be held in the new Madison Square Garden in New York on Feb. 4. He will compete in both the Millrose "600" and the pole vaulting event in that meet.

The foregoing despatch means that Boston almost surely will get a look at the famous Norwegian in action, for if he competes in the Millrose games he will also visit Boston the following Saturday for the B. A. A. games in the Arena. Hoff had planned to invade America last winter when he was prevented from doing so at the last minute by an ultimatum of the Norwegian athletic officials, whom he has criticized adversely in a newspaper article. John G. Anderson, athletic director of the Millrose A. A., finally ironed out that trouble, but too late to permit Hoff to arrive here in time for the Millrose meet. At that time, however, the Norwegian athlete assured Anderson that he would try to come to this country this winter, and the announcement above is a result of that promise. Hoff is one of the finest middle distance runners in the world and probably the finest pole vaulter and his appearance in the B. A. A. games should provide just as much interest as did the appearance of Paavo Nurmi last winter.

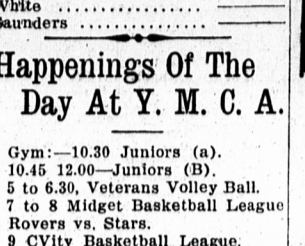

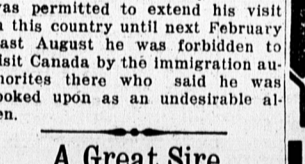
