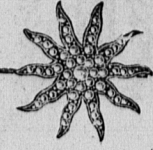

N. R. DesBrissay, T. P. A., in the interests of the railway and steamship service of the C. P. R., St. John, was in the city yesterday and left in the afternoon for Summerside.

In response to a telegram Benj Carter, Auctioneer, City, left yesterday afternoon for Summerside to meet the thirty, (30) young cyclists (ladies) imported direct from Scotland by William Maharry of Ontario. They will arrive in this city this morning via first train.

Captain Fred W. L. Moore, D. S. A., of St. John, inspector of clothing and equipment of all the rifle association and artillery of New Brunswick, is in the city. Captain Moore started his inspection yesterday and will be through this afternoon.—Moncton Ex. (Capt. Moore is a native of this city)

The Christmas picture of Santa Claus, with the group of little boys and girls now on exhibition in J. A. S. Bayer's showcase on Sunnyside, is an exceedingly clever piece of work. The little ones, all of whom are city folk known to those who meet or visit the Kindergarten, are grouped in an attitude of suspense and expectation and is perhaps one of the finest pieces of work to leave Mr. Bayer's artistic pen. It is well worth walking up town to see.

The S. S. Stigstad arrived in port this morning from Montreal for Bunker coal, and has some repairs made to her machinery. The S. S. Stigstad is a Norwegian steamer of 2500 tons net and has been engaged during the past season carrying coal for the Dominion Coal Co., Ltd., from Sydney to Montreal. She experienced very stormy weather on her downward voyage this trip. After being supplied with about 200 tons of Bunker Coal by Peake Bros & Co., she sails this morning for Sydney, P. E. I. The S. S. Stigstad, when loaded carries a cargo of about 7500 tons coal.

A Charlottetonian had the pleasure recently of calling on James A. McKinnon, son of the late Laughlin McKinnon of Tryon, at his place of business in Ansonia, Conn. Mr. McKinnon may well be considered "a successful Islander abroad." He now owns a two-storey shop, 50x60, in addition to a large paint house and eight-room residence. His business is conducted on up-to-date lines, equipped with the latest improved machinery, has a capacity for horseshoeing from eighty to ninety horses daily and employs from seven to nine men the year round. His power is secured from a ten horse-power motor and three fires equipped with separate electric bellows. The work is all conducted on the strictest business lines, each and every man turning out only the best work. Mr. McKinnon, on Aug. 28, 1910, opened a store at Shelton, Conn., about three miles from his home, and has as his partner, Dr. Monell, a veterinary of much skill and experience. These two men are employed and kept busy engaged at all times, blacksmithing and general jobbing. Electric power horse clippers have been used for some time past by the firm and are in great demand. 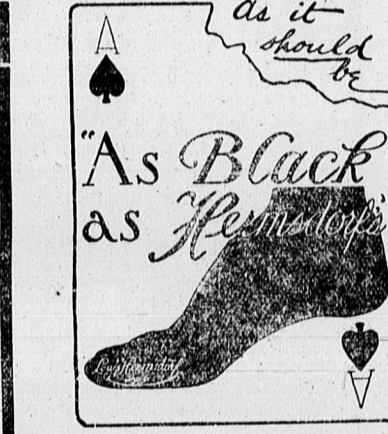
