# BIOGRAPHY OF TIPPERARY

The biography of "Tipperary" and also of some other war songs is given by a New York Sun writer, who maintains that the now dominant song of the soldier was "In the Army". "It's a Long, Long Way to Tipperary," the marching song of the British army was written right here in New York. It was composed three years ago, but it needed a great war to bring it into popularity.

"It was originally intended for a little vaudeville skit. The composer of it, Harry Williams, is also the composer of that treasured local lyric, 'I'm Afraid to Go Home in the Dark.' "There's an old history to all these songs that sweep into favor with the ton of a drum.
