On motion of Councillor Cox, seconded by Councillor Reid, James Millman's salary as teamster was increased for the winter months to the same amount as in summer. Council adjourned until Dec. 28.

Leard.—Mrs. Horace Howatt is confined to the house with sciatica.—Quite a number are smelt fishing on Bedouque Bay but so far the fish are very scarce.—Mrs. Dr. Champion is still very sick but is on the road to recovery.

In the civic bye-election of Saturday, in which the candidates were, for Mayor, Ronald Campbell and H. A. Compton; for Councillors, Joseph Cox, D. A. Pickering and G. M. Reid, there were 533 people voted, of whom eleven spoiled their ballots. Out of the 522 good ballots, 410 were marked for the elective number, one Mayor and two Councillors; 86 were for Mayor only; 6 for two Councillors and no Mayor; 1 for one Councillor and no Mayor. In all there were seventeen differently marked ballots. Here is how the people voted: For Compton, Cox and Reid, (the elect) 153 votes; for Compton and Cox, 58 votes; for Compton, Pickering and Reid, 46 votes; for Compton and Reid, 9 votes; for Compton and Pickering, 6 votes; for Compton only, 3 votes. For Campbell, Pickering and Reid, 14 votes; for Campbell, Cox and Reid, 31 votes; for Campbell, Cox and Pickering, 17 votes; for Campbell and Pickering, 9 votes; for Campbell and Cox, 7 votes; for Campbell and Reid, 6 votes; for Campbell only, 5 votes; for Cox and Reid, 4 votes; for Pickering and Reid, 2 votes; for Pickering only, 1 vote. There were fourteen electors who did not vote for any of the elected candidates. Of Compton's supporters, 235 voted for Cox, 215 for Reid, and 67 for Pickering; 61 did not vote for Cox, 34 did not support Reid, and 232 did not mark their ballots for Pickering. Of Campbell's supporters, 179 voted for Reid, 169 for Pickering, and 51 for Cox; 36 did not vote for Reid, 49 did not support Pickering, and 164 did not vote for Cox. Thus it will be seen that as only three candidates for Councillor were contesting for but two seats, Mr. Reid got the "crossed vote" from a large number of supporters of both candidates for Mayor.

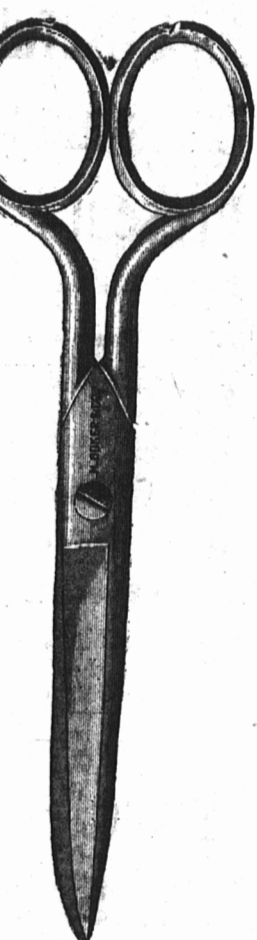
