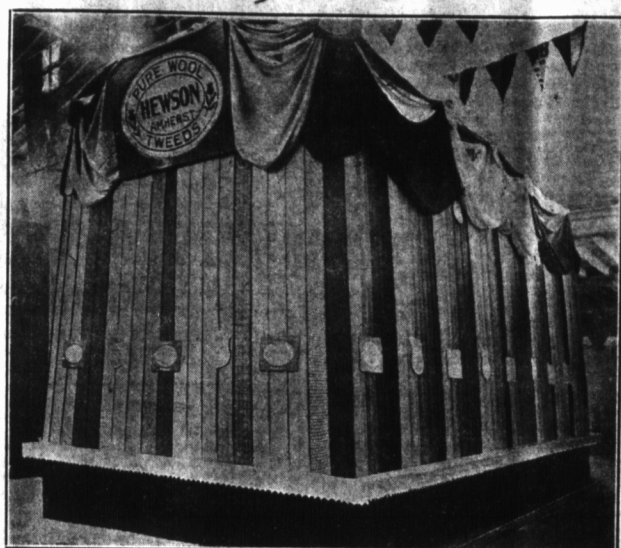

## REMARKABLE GROWTH OF HEWSON MILLS

Enlarged This year to Double Former Capacity -- Great Popularity of their Clothes in all Markets-- Underwear and Knitted Goods to be Manufactured.

A little over three years ago the Hewson Woolen Mills at Amherst started with what was then considered to be a very large and fine woolen mill plant and equipment. In due course the goods were placed on the market and received such a splendid reception owing to their excellent quality and fine appearance, both as to design and texture, that the machinery then installed was found wholly insufficient to meet the demands.

Those who carefully examined the Company's exhibit of suitings at the Provincial Exhibition, would not fail to realize that a very great advance had taken place in the quality and characteristics of the goods which the mill is now turning out. The reception these finer and more expensive cloths have already received at the hands of the best trade of Canada, warrants the Company in looking for a vastly enlarged business.

More weaving machinery was added and other equipment installed almost without any cessation, until the original buildings would no longer afford room for more. During the summer of 1905 a three-story brick and stone structure, 55 by 75 feet, was erected and fitted with new carding, spinning and weaving machinery. As the winter came on the demand for Hewson goods increased again with surprising rapidity and the management and directors of the mills began to plan on further extensions, which a short time before would have seemed unwarranted. But with the markets of Canada from Coast to Coast, as well as those of the United States, the West Indies, Mexico and other foreign lands calling for enlarged output to meet their requirements, it was decided to make a bold move and more than double the capacity of the factory which six months ago stretched its length imposingly along the line of the Intercolonial Railway at Amherst.

Plans were accordingly procured from the best mill architect in the United States, and orders placed for large quantities of materials which were soon upon the ground, and since early spring, work has been pushed forward with satisfactory speed, until now the new buildings, one 240 feet long, four stories high, and another 100 feet long by 50 feet wide, of the most modern style, made of brick and stone and heavy timber, according to the most approved mill construction, are almost ready to receive the machinery, which in fact has commenced to arrive from the best makers in the world.

In this large new addition, there will be installed a complete plant for the manufacture of Underwear and other knitted garments for men's, women's and children's wear. This division will be under the superintendence of W. A. Ingalls, of New York, a master mechanic and technical expert, in the manufacture of knitted goods, having had a wide experience in the largest mills of that country. The skill and thorough knowledge which Mr. Ingalls will combine with the well known push and enterprise of the Hewson concern will, without doubt, place the new combined industry in a much stronger position for entering into the trade.

The quality of the Hewson goods will, as always, maintain their high standard.

The exhibit as a display, represents fabrics and designs showing some of the many hundreds of patterns that are available for the various classes of trade for which the mills cater. No exhibit has received more favorable comment, not only from the general public, but also from those in the trade, and therefore possibly more familiar with the points of excellence in textiles of this character.
