LIQUOR THROWN INTO THE RIVER AT SUSSEX, N.B.

Clergymen Constables and Great Crowd In The Funeral Procession - Great Applause Greeted Magistrate's Decision Confiscating The Liquor

Sussex, N. B., Dec. 29.—A large number of people visited the police court room lately to hear argument re Scott Act cases, which have caused much interest of late.

Court adjourned to Metley Memorial Hall where the seized liquors were stored. The case against Sylvester Madden was heard.

Magistrate Horobrook was not long in rendering judgment. He found the defendant guilty and sentenced him to thirty days without the option of a fine, and gave an order for the destruction of the liquor belonging to Madden. The Magistrate was applauded after his decision.

Late in the afternoon preparations were made for the destruction of the liquor. When it was learned that it was to be destroyed, a large crowd gathered to witness it. A procession was formed headed by Rev. Frank Baird and Rev. Dr. Rogers; next came Inspector Cusack and his body guard, then "the remains" followed by about 200 citizens. They proceeded along the left bank of the Kennebecasis River to what is known as the town dumping

ground, here some twenty-six cases, four kegs and six barrels were destroyed. The bottles were broken against stones, and the kegs and barrels bursted in with axes. It was an amusing sight.

RENT CRUSADES RAPID GROWTH NEW YORK CITY

The Movement To Obtain Lower Rents Is Now Well Organized

New York, Dec. 29.—There were tenement house meetings on almost every block today. Many of the tenants were of the opinion that their end could best be accomplished by resisting attempts at collecting present rents and affording shelter to persons evicted. There were others who favored more drastic measures and many tenants discussed a combined stand against the marshals in the event of evictions.

Pauline Newman, who is reputed to be the woman of the strike movement is in favor of moderation. She had told the women associate with her that they can hope to win by united action if they are careful to keep within the law and that the landlords if a united front is presented to them will be found to yield rather than fight out thousands of dispossession cases in the municipal courts.


