ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

At a large and representative meeting of the Southern Kings' Board of Trade on Saturday a resolution was unanimously passed asking for the construction of a branch railway from the Murray Harbor line to Cardigan passing through Montague.

EASTERN NOTES—Extremely variable weather is still the rule. The unusual phenomenon of heavy thunder and vivid lightning was witnessed here on the morning of the 5th of Feb., something unheard of at that date by that much-consulted person the "oldest inhabitant." The second time we had thunder and lightning within a week, and both times preceded and succeeded by extreme cold. RULES OF THE WORD.

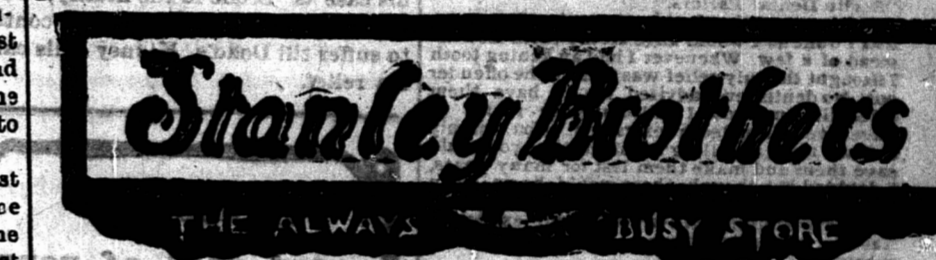
