THE USE OF THE POET By Bookman

Some years ago when Lord Bryce landed in New York, newsmen met him and immediately asked him what he thought the United States needed most. To their surprise he answered, "Poets." When memorials were being dedicated to Lampman and Bliss Carman in Ontario some time back, Arthur Stringer, in showing the value of poets to a people, paraphrased some lines from Horace thus: "In vain their ages and their chiefsains pride. They had no poet and they died; In vain they lived, in vain they died."

And so James came to another milestone on the road of life. And what has time done to him in these later years? Given him a few more silver threads among the brown but otherwise not brought much change. A bit more started perhaps at the end of some day, yet with the same brisk step at morning and with interest in his farming, unabated. Indeed I fancy increased, if such a word could be used in connection with his records in husbandry. And what is James like? It looks "a heap o' livin'" with James' old "big one of the family, though Rob, inquisitively laughing he must be standing on tip-toe such times as they compare heights! Brown-eyed, admittedly faded a little but still able to twinkle merrily especially when resting on one of the grand-children or other small ones. Taking life seriously: "We are not here to dream, to drift; we have hard work to do, and loads to lift." This embraces James' philosophy of living. Canny in adopting new ways, new methods of farming, yet studying by actual practice to improve the old. Taking care of details down to the smallest penny piglet - "It wasn't put in this world to die, Ellen" and looking well to the ways of his work. Enjoying it above all else and liking with a strange reverence the home which for many a year has housed his own people.

Entertaining the like of Jamie and older folks with tales of its past. "Here it was..." he will say and go on to weave a story which I too find fascinating since it deals with the past and present. Kindly, James is, especially to those of "low estate" - that is, not too blest with worldly goods. "Not more fortunate, Ellen, have not so much need of close friendship, it is those not so blest, I would favour, and don't forget" he will explain "no matter about the 'famey fare' or the 'hadden gray' - a man's a man for a' that!" This then is James and, in spite of his busy choring, being careful to reach the house across the lane in time to have a romp with granddaughters before her bedtime; taking time too to call Jamie to hear of his interests or to enjoy his visits and taking delight in making friends with the younger shy fellow rather reserved yet in the selection of his friends and family.

By lantern light now he comes indoors at week's end. As he hangs jacket and cap behind the door he hums a snatch of a tune. It is one he was wont to sing with Karoly and me last Sunday in the quiet of the afternoon, while I painstakingly picked out the notes on the piano. Comforting and extremely wonderful in their meaning I find the words of this one of James' favorite Psalms.

"I to the hills will lift mine eyes; From whence doeth come mine aid? My safety cometh from the Lord, Who heaven and earth hath made."

That body of yours drops to 3,100 in the desert with the temperature 92 degrees above zero F.

Average daily calorie levels maintained in various areas were 4,400 in Canada, 3,900 in the Colorado Rockies, 3,800 in temperate regions of the United States, 3,400 in tropical Pacific Islands, and 3,200 in the Philippines.

In cold climates, more heat is required to keep the body heat at its proper level, and more food is needed for the extra work made necessary by the hobbling effects of heavy clothing and equipment.

The thought, then, is whether travelling to or residing in climates different from your own, you will feel better and do better work by eating the same kinds of foods as at home, but eating more food in the cold and less in the warm climates.
