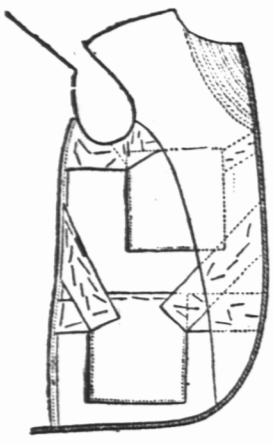

Meet tomorrow are this morning on exhibition at Gourlie's Drug Store and it is safe to say that such a display of trophies for a similar occasion has never been seen on the Island. The silver cups are large and artistically modelled, the medals neat and handsome and all suitably engraved. Besides these there is a large number of useful articles from different donors. The management of the S.A.A.A. are to be congratulated on the promptness with which these prizes have been secured and no doubt all their arrangements for the sports have been made with the same tact. It may be confidently expected that tomorrow's meet will be the biggest in the history of the association.

By a private letter Monday night from Mr. Creel McArthur, who is on his way home from British Columbia, it is learned that the train by which he was travelling met with a bad accident last Friday morning about 25 miles west of Fort William. In coming round a curve, the rear car—a sleeper—got derailed, and after tearing up the road bed for about a quarter of a mile, broke away and went off altogether. There were about 20 passengers in the car—all of whom were in their berths at the time of the accident. The confusion that followed was frightful. Men, women and children—bustled out into the night in their sleeping garments, or working their way through windows and doors, many of them badly injured—some with broken collar bones, broken ribs, cuts and bruises and all expecting death. To add to the confusion the car took fire from the oil and broken lamps, but the flames were extinguished without much damage from that source. Fortunately no one was killed, and his many friends here will be pleased to know that Mr. McArthur escaped unhurt. The wrecking train and doctors sent for had not arrived when the letter was written.

A Naval Reserve.

St. JOHN'S Nfld., August 2.—Geseben, first Lord of the Admiralty, has arranged to organize a naval reserve among the Newfoundland fishermen, enrolling 500 who will be drilled by instructors sent from England. Fortifications are being erected especially for this purpose. The men are receiving \$50 each cash for each month engaged. Newfoundland is the only colony where the experiment is being tried.
