He wore yesterday, going to church, a top hat of light gray color with black band one and one half inches wide. This suit was of plain cheviot, solid in color, and darker in shade than the top hat, which he continued to wear all afternoon. The collar lapels were cut low and partly faced with silk slightly different in shade from the cloth. The coat had three buttons in front and overlapped. Trousers were of same material as coat. ### NIGHTS PYTHIAS CAMP NEXT WEEK

BOSTON, July 29.—Apparently the occasion is a very strong feeling against allowing the big army of Knights of Pythias which will gather in Boston on Monday next to pitch their tents on Franklin Park.

Tomorrow night the Harvard Improvement Association will hold a mass meeting at which the matter will be thoroughly discussed and some sort of action decided upon.

Chairman Stratton of the park commission, through whom the permission for the use of the park as a camping ground was obtained some months ago, declares that the matter is closed so far as the park commission was concerned with the granting of the permit.

In a few days the vanguard of the Pythian army, which 100,000 strong is soon to invade Boston will make their appearance in the city preparatory to their twenty-fifth biennial convention, which opens next Monday. Many of them will be accompanied by their wives and daughters, members of the Pythian sisterhood. Officially the occasion is the twenty-fifth biennial convention of the Supreme Lodge of Knights of Pythias, the international Council of the Pythian Sisterhood and the supreme encampment of the Uniform Rank of the Knights of Pythias.

### NEGRO BURNED AT THE STAKE

DALLAS, Tex., July 29.—"Tad" Smith, a negro boy, 18 years old, charged with criminal assault on Miss Viola Delaney, at Clinton Hunt county, yesterday, was captured by officers early today. He was taken before the young woman and identified. The prisoner was then hurried to the Greenville jail.

Before arriving there, however, a mob of citizens overpowered the officers, took the prisoner and prepared to hang him. This idea was given up, however, and the mob agreed to burn him at the stake. Fagots were piled up in the public square at Greenville and the negro was placed thereon. Kerosene oil was poured on and a match applied. Smith slowly burned to death while a thousand persons witnessed the execution by fire.

**LIVE STOCK WERE POISONED.**

Vankleek Hill, Ont., July 29.—An unknown enemy has been operating around Mr. McCallum's farm in East Hawkesbury, with the result that three horses and three cows were poisoned with Paris green. His barn was set on fire and a threatening letter was mailed to a post warning him that more trouble was in store for him.

The County Crown Attorney has been notified and has communicated with the Justice Department. It is expected an officer will be put on the case.

### A SIGHTSEER'S NARROW ESCAPE.

CALGARY, Alta., July 29.—All Banff and the hundreds of visitors are talking of the sensational yet not miraculous escape of Baron von Rosenberg from a terrible and tragic death this week. The baron, who is a German sightseer, was, with a friend, climbing Mount Rundle, when he stepped on some projecting snow near the summit of this famous mountain. His weight caused the bank to give way and he was carried down with it about 40 feet. Fortunately at this point there was a small cliff under which he was carried and there he remained in safety while the tons of ice and snow rumbled over him on its mad rush to the base. It would be hard to imagine the baron's feelings while the terrible avalanche was passing over him. The slightest move and he would have been buried beneath a thousand tons of ice. When the avalanche ended the baron crept out from under the cliff and descended to the village hundreds of feet below and received hearty congratulations on his escape.

### ADMIRALS WILL BE REMOVED.

London, July 29.—To preserve the discipline of the navy, Sir Percy Scott, whose command of the cruiser squadron has still a year to run, has been appointed to the command of a special small squadron which will visit South Africa in the autumn during the sitting of the Convention for the Federation of the South African Colonies.

The appointment is evidently made to remove the possibility of further friction between Sir Percy Scott and Lord Chas. Bessford.

### VENEZUELAN HAS CLOSED PORTS.

PORT-AU-SPAIN, July 29.—President Castro, of Venezuela, has issued decrees, completely closing ports to import and export trade with the West Indies. British colonies will appeal to Great Britain.

### ROWING AT HENLEY, ENGLAND.

HENLEY, Eng., July 29.—Canada was successful in only one heat rowed today in the International Regatta. Toronto Argonauts beat the Norwegian Rowing Association crew by a length in the first heat of eight. Scholes was beaten by Von Gaze, German, by a length and a half in the singles.
