ELECTION PETITION TRIED AT GEORGETOWN

GEORGETOWN, Sept. 29.—(Special by Telephone.)—The election petition of John James McDonald against A. L. Fraser, the elective candidate for Queen's county, was called on for trial at Georgetown on Tuesday, the 28th inst, before Chief Justice Sullivan and Mr Justice Fitzgerald. Attorney General Haszard, K. C., Mr Johnson, K. C., City, G. S. Inman of Montague and Calvin McCallum of Souris, appeared as counsel for the petitioner, and Mr Mathieson, K.C. and Albin McDonald acted as counsel for the defendant. The court opened Tuesday morning shortly after the arrival of the train from Charlottetown, which had conveyed Mr Justice Fitzgerald and the leading counsel on both sides. The Chief Justice had reached Georgetown the previous evening. The greater part of Tuesday morning's session was taken up in hearing objections on behalf of the defendant to the particulars as delivered by the petitioner, the defendant claiming that these particulars were vague and indefinite and not in compliance with the order of the chief Justice. After arguments on both sides some of the particulars were amended to make them more definite, whilst the others, to which objections were made, allowed to stand as delivered. The trial then proceeded on the merit of the petition. The first witness called, on behalf of the petitioner, stated that on the Sunday night previous to the election, a knock came to his door and he went out in the dark and met person who knocked. He was asked how he was going to vote at the election, and he replied that it would have to be made worth his while before he would vote. The stranger, who was in disguise, threw down on the ground a five dollar note and said "that will make it worth your while to vote." The voter could not answer who the person was, to which objections were made, allowed to stand as delivered. The trial then proceeded on the merit of the petition. BRITISH SHIP IS PLEER OF THEM ALL. NEW YORK, Sept. 28.—The sailormen of eight nations—England, Germany, France, Italy, Holland, Mexico, Argentina and the United States, wandered along the streets of New York today, mingling with visitors from north, south, east and west in the first day of rest after the brilliant opening of the Hudson-Fulton celebration yesterday. Beginning at noon, Riverside Drive, a vantage point affording a magnificent view of the anchored armada of battleships, began to fill up rapidly and at three o'clock was again uncomfortably crowded, although there was no organized naval parade today. The Half Moon and the Olernont lay quietly at their anchorages, where they will remain until the naval parade of Friday, October 1, when these little pioneers, escorted by light draft warships and followed by the merchant fleet again will sail up stream to Newburg, where they will be turned over to the Albany upstate division of the celebration.

EXCURSION STEAMERS. But circling about the fleet of battleships today there was an almost unbroken line of seep sea excursion steamers jammed to the rails, as they were yesterday, and listing heavily to one side with the pressure of the crowds. At the same time a scurrying flotilla of motor boats was bobbing about on the rougher waters of the river, carrying visitors to and from those battleships which were receiving for the day. American officers spoke today of the splendid appearance of the British flagship Inflexible, whose illumination last night was conspicuously brilliant. Spic and span in her new paint and dressed from stern to stern in white awnings, her graceful lines of speed and power combined were more remarked today than those of any other ship on the river.
