The teacher's reports showed the enrollment for the past month to be 1079, the average attendance 921.49, the percentage 89.59—number of cases of tardiness 169, truancy 10, visits 135, notices 47, corporal punishment 10, below average in grading 44; requests to leave school during the session 48. Five teachers report no cases of tardiness. The highest percentage made was 96.22 and sixteen teachers had averages ranging from 98 to 96. The following were appointed visiting committees for the month: Prince Street School: Dr. Jenkins and Judge Blanchard; Queen Square School: Mr. Nash and Mr. Smith; West Kent School: Mr. James and R. M. Johnson. After passing some bills the meeting adjourned.
