

**ON BUOY SERVICE**—The C.G.S. Montcalm, Captain Mercier, is at present placing buoys in Island waters. **POTATO AND FERTILIZER STEAMERS**—The steamer "Anders" is loading potatoes at Summerside for the Potato Growers' Association. She will take part of the cargo there and the balance at Georgetown, in all 40,000 bushels for New York, and expects to leave the Island on Thursday. This will be the last steamer to be loaded by the Association this spring. The Association also loaded the "Laly" which sailed from Victoria on Saturday with 50,000 bushels for New York. The steamer "Gypsum Prince" with a cargo of 6,000 tons of fertilizer for the Association is now in Summerside, and a sister ship, the "Gypsum Queen" with 5,000 is due in Charlottetown today. The Norwegian steamer "Vorma," Captain Makensen, arrived in Georgetown from Saint John yesterday to load 35,000 bushels of potatoes for Philadelphia. This steamer was chartered by Poole & Thompson, Montague, and the shippers will include that firm, also J. A. MacDonald & Company, Cardigan, and Austin Seales, Free-town.



so lower. The bulk of the calves were common to just fair quality. Medium good Quebec calves averaging close to 130 pounds brought \$6.50, and one lot of 25 medium to good calves weighing 138 pounds each brought \$5.75 and calves of fair to medium quality were sold around \$4.50 to \$5.25. Common to plain calves were sold for \$3.50 to \$4.25 with very common drinkers as low as \$3.

Quotations: Good veal \$3 to \$6.30; medium \$5 to \$5.75; common \$3 to \$5, grass \$3.

Sheep receipts 163. The bulk of the sheep brought \$4.50 to \$5.50. One lot of 55 good sheep was sold for \$5.50. Common clipped sheep brought as low as \$2.50. Spring lambs were selling slowly at \$5 to \$6.50 each. Common light lambs were not wanted.

Quotations: Ewes \$2.50 to \$5.50. Lambs good \$5 to \$6.50.
