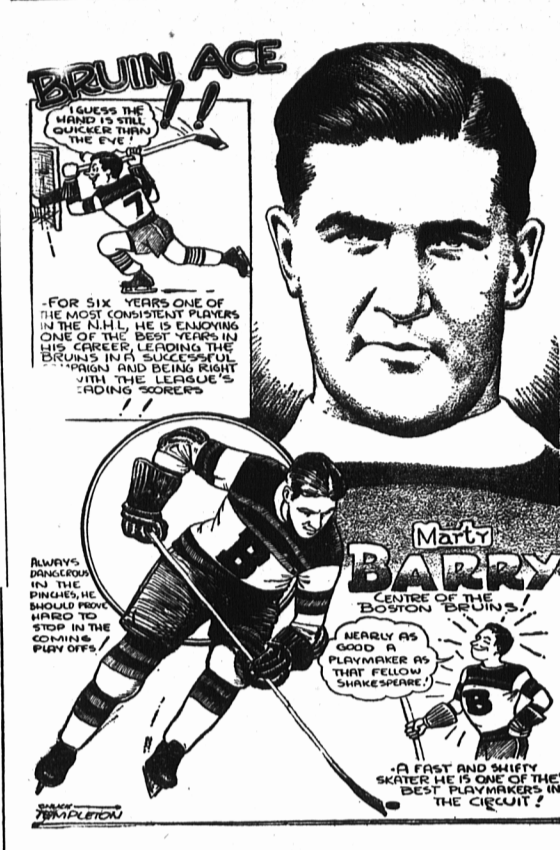
Ice Racing

About an hour after the referee-in-chief and the Crystals had left the rink, the assistant, Douglas Bell, called the Borden team on the ice and scored the two goals numbered as seven and eight in the summary of this game, thus claiming the game for Borden.
