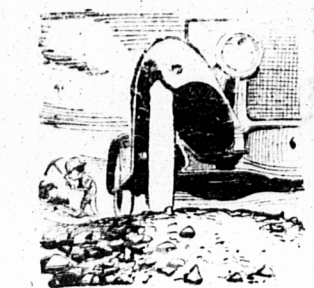

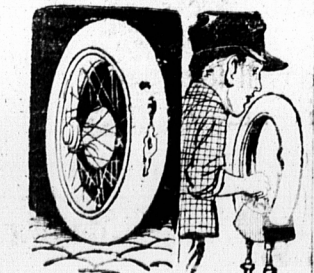

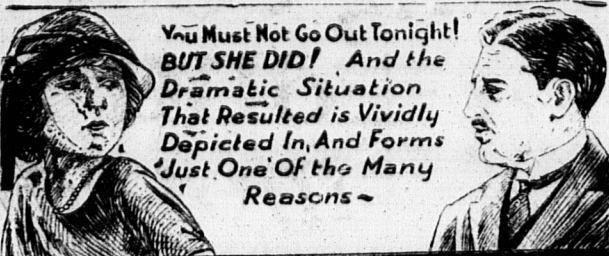

FOR SCHOOL PRIZES—Mr. G. Ballingall, publisher of the new map of Prince Edward Island, has handed to the Chief Superintendent of Education, a sum of \$120.00, to be distributed in prizes to the Public School pupils passing an examination in the Geography of Prince Edward Island and their teachers. The competition is open only to the pupils of those of our Public Schools which possess Ballingall's new map of Prince Edward Island. Pupils of the Charlottetown and Summerside schools are not eligible. The examination will be held in the several schools on the 15th of June, 1922. The prizes are as follows: To the pupils in each County making the highest marks in the examination: 1st prize, \$5.00; 2nd prize, \$3.00; 3rd prize, \$2.00 and twenty prizes of \$1.00 each. To the teacher in each County, whose pupil wins the 1st prize, \$5.00; to the teacher, whose pupil wins the 2nd prize, \$3.00; and to the teacher, whose pupil wins the 3rd prize, \$2.00.

HONORS TO BE CONFERRED.—Rev. George E. Ross, St. Matthew's Church, Point St. Charles, one of Montreal's most popular and gifted clergymen, will receive the degree of Doctor of Divinity at the Presbyterian Theological College, Halifax, next Wednesday evening. In addition to receiving the degree of Doctor of Divinity he has been honored by an invitation to deliver the convocation address, his theme being "The Joy of the Ministry." Convocation of Pine Hill College takes place Wednesday evening the 19th inst., in St. Matthew's Church, Halifax. The following facts in connection with Rev. Mr. Ross' career are of interest. Gold medalist Platon Academy 1889; senior Munro exhibition, Dalhousie, 1891; "B. A. Dalhousie with distinction," and Avery prize, 1893; B. D. Presbyterian College, Halifax, (Pine Hill), 1896 minister of Bethany Church, Halifax; missionary to British Guiana; minister of Maitland, N. S., Charlottetown, P. E. I., Goderich, Ont., and minister of St. Matthew's, Montreal, 1916. During his term of ministry in Zion church, Charlottetown, Rev. Mr. Ross founded the "Order of Recruits for the Ministry" which has since become an organization of international interest. During 25 years ministry it has been his privilege to have ordained over 100 young men for the ministry, many of whom have completed their course. It is of special interest to Mr. Ross that one of his Recruits is graduating at the Convocation Wednesday evening next having completed a distinguished course in Arts and Theology and winning the prize for oration. His name is Sutherland Bonnel, of Charlottetown, P. E. I.
