EQUAL SUFFRAGE IN VIRGINIA

LYNCHBURG, Va., Oct. 23.—The most vital matter which will come up before the annual State convention of the Virginia Equal Suffrage League, which opened its two-days' session here today with a large attendance, will be the campaign proposed to be waged before the general assembly in the interest of equal suffrage.

MADE FOR CANADA.

OTTAWA, Oct. 21.—Within a couple of years Canada will be able to boast possession of the largest reflecting telescope in the world. Where it is to be erected has not been finally decided, but it is not improbable that it will be placed in the vicinity of the present Dominion Observatory at the Central Experimental Farm at Ottawa.

An Order-in-Council has been passed awarding the contract for the mechanism to Warner and Swasey, Cleveland, and for the mirror to the John A. Brashear Co., Pittsburgh, the firms which supplied the telescope now in use by the astronomical branch of the Interior Department.

The mirror, which is to be six feet in diameter, will be twelve inches greater in dimension than the largest now in commission. It will be moulded in France and owing to its great mass the glass cast will require eight months to anneal.

ASTRONOMICAL BODIES IN GREAT BRITAIN, CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

MAKE NEW NOSE OUT OF MAN'S RIB.

BALTIMORE, Md., Oct. 23.—Physicians at St. Joseph's Hospital have succeeded in building a new nose from a human rib. An incision was made in the side of Lynn Davis, a railroad employe and a piece of cartilage a little over two inches long was cut from the third rib and shaped for the shattered bone.

MINING CONGRESS ASKS STOCK PROBE.

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 23.—A resolution adopted at the American Mining Congress refers to the "dishonest operations of the financially powerful" as a great menace to the mining industry.

MILITANTS AGAIN ON WAR PATH

LONDON, Oct. 23.—An "arsenal" of militant suffragettes today set fire to and destroyed the sports pavilion of Bristol University. They left the usual tail-tale suffragette literature scattered about the grounds.

The public prosecutor decided today that he would not proceed against "General" Mrs. Flora Drummond, who was taken ill in June last while proceedings were in progress against her for infringement of the malicious damage to property act. She underwent an operation and since then has been continually in ill health.

GERMAN ROYALTY AT-TEND THE FUNERALS.

BERLIN, Oct. 21.—A most impressive funeral service was held today over the bodies of twenty-three out of the twenty-eight victims of the disaster to the Zeppelin dirigible airship at Johannisthal on Friday last.

The relatives of the deceased took their places around the coffins which occupied the entire chancel of the church, and were buried beneath masses of wreaths from the members of the Imperial family, the Foreign Embassies and Legations and various naval and military veteran organizations, and the families of the dead soldiers and sailors.

The attaches of the various Foreign Legations also were present in full uniform. After the service in the church seven of the bodies were taken to the adjoining cemetery for burial.

The six sons of the Emperor headed the procession of mourners. The others were taken to the homes of the dead men in various parts of the country.

Prince Eitel Fritz, while coming from Potsdam in his automobile to attend the funeral ceremony struck a five-year-old boy with the wheel of his machine, while the child was darting across the street. The boy was seriously injured.

STRIKING MINERS IN MICHIGAN ATTACK DEPUTY SHERIFFS.

CALUMET, Mich., Oct. 23.—Striking copper miners in the Calumet district attacked deputy sheriffs this morning while the workmen were going to the mines. Ed. Beakdoin, a deputy, was seriously stabbed, three others were badly beaten and another's clothes were slashed.

SULZER AGAIN AFTER GOVERNMENT

NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—William Sulzer opened headquarters at a Broadway hotel today for his campaign to re-establish himself at the state capital. Informally he plunged into the fight as soon as he stepped from a late train from Albany, last night, but from today on, until election November 4th he planned to conduct an organized campaign with his private secretary, Chester C. Platt acting as manager for election to the state assembly.

The fusionists, seeking the election of John Purroy Mitchell, as Mayor are guarded in expressing enthusiasm over the entry of the deposed Governor into the campaign, but they make no secret of their satisfaction over the fight, which Mr. Sulzer has declared against Tammany Hall, the defeat of whose power, the fusionists profess to be their main object.

By installment, Mr. Sulzer continues to bring forth charges that Charles P. Murphy leader of Tammany Hall, made threats to him while he was Governor, and that Edward B. McCall, the Tammany candidate for Mayor, had acted as an emissary of the Tammany leader, charges of falsehood, while Mr. Murphy has preserved his usual reticence, declaring only that he will wait until Mr. Sulzer has finished all of his accusations before replying.
