

SOLDIERS RETURN

From South Africa as
Noted by

MR. LESLIE MCBETH

Of the South African Contingent Who Reached the City Saturday.

The following are a few notes of the trip from Cape Town to Halifax by Mr Leslie McBeth. After a send off at Cape Town we sailed on board the Kildona Castle for Portsmouth. There were 1300 on board, 400 hospital patients, the balance, however, were able to look after themselves. After being six days at sea, one of the number who was insane jumped overboard. An attempt was made to find him but it was thought that he came in contact with the propeller and was killed. All went well until three days before we reached Portsmouth, when the most solemn sight of the trip, or of any voyage, occurred—a burial at sea. One of the retired man died of Asthma. He was tied up in his blanket, and entwined with a Union Jack, and after the burial service of the Church of England was read by the Chaplain the remains were interred in the sea.

At Portsmouth the troops were conveyed by rail to Port Elson before going on furlough. After spending two weeks visiting London—where we met Ernest Lord who was on furlough. He was looking well and would hardly be known by his friends in Charlottetown we returned to Shontcliff, the Canadian depot where the Imperial discharge was given. On Nov. 1st. the 24 Canadians started for Liverpool. The officer in charge was instructed to take the Canadians to a certain barracks, but when they arrived they found that the place of their destination had been torn down some 20 years before. Through the kindness of the Allan people the men were taken to the Canadian Hotel where breakfast was served. The Lord Mayor sent an invitation for the Canadians to dine with him at noon. Being a colonial His Lordships knew how to entertain and delivered a ringing speech to which Mr. Mellish responded.

The Allan people held their boat two hours and at 3 o'clock the 24 Canadians who had been royally entertained, left for their Canadian home. The passage on the Carthazianian was pleasant, the Allan Lane people generously supplying the Canadians with a second-class ticket, instead of the third given by the Imperial Government. At Newfoundland the reception was a magnificent one. Mr. R. Reid and City Club entertaining the Contingent. After spending three days the band escorted the troops to the station and at 5 o'clock Tuesday evening left for Port au Basque, arriving there at 11 o'clock Wednesday night, taking the Bruce for Sydney, thence by rail to Halifax for final discharge. The men are loud in praise of Mr. Reid and the royal reception given by the people of Newfoundland.
