Anchors Score Run In 13th To Take Playoff Opener

L. P. U. Anchors drew first blood in the City League finals Sunday afternoon taking the North End Rovers into camp 10-9 in a hard fought struggle that saw the West team overcome a two-run deficit in the last of the ninth to send the game into extra innings where they go on to push over the winning tally in the last of the thirteenth.

The Rovers had a two-run lead as the Anchors came to bat in the last of the ninth but their defence blew sky high committing five successive errors allowing the Anchors to stage a comeback and deadlock the score 8-8 forcing extra innings.

There was no score in the tenth innings by either side and in the top of the eleventh the Rovers made a further error in the ninth inning scoring on Whitlock's long fly; right field. Two were out in the bottom of the ninth and the Anchors then again squared matters. Vernie Larier scoring on Fat Connors' double. The North End team didn't threaten in the next two innings but in the Anchors' half of the thirteenth Charlie Ryan singled and scored on a throw from the field while Whitlock batted Connors' grounder to short.

Errors accounted for most of the scoring with the Rovers usually steady indeed having eight miscues charged against them and the Anchors inner defence four. Right hander, Connors' steady striking out ten batters and scattering thirteen hits over the thirteen innings he worked. Cyril Smith went the route for the Rovers giving up twelve hits and striking out five.

Glen Matheson in the Rovers' left pasture and Irving McKinnon, Anchors second sacker shared the fielding honors. Matheson had six putouts on fly balls, most of the hard variety while McKinnon on line drives.

Buck Whitlock was the leading batter with five hits in six trips to the plate.

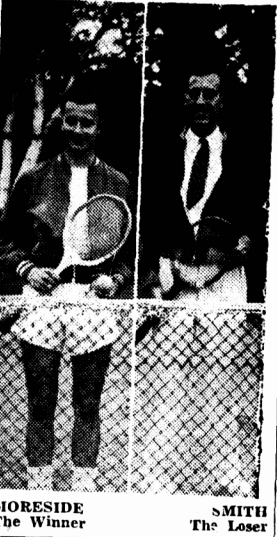

GOLF

Frank Stranahan of Toledo, Ohio, will be one of the favorites when the National Amateur Championship is revived at Baltusrol, Sept. 8th to 14th, it is played with Frank Stranahan as the defending champion at Kansas City, it was that tournament with a 14 under par score of 274 for the 72 holes and I don't remember ever seeing him play better.

One reason why I think Frank Stranahan is a favorite is that he has been in recent months that he didn't practice as much as he should have. Frank needed plenty of practice before he began to play the tournament circuit, but once he started playing competitive golf his schedule was too strenuous.

There's a limit to what you can do, even when you're as rugged as Frank. Not only was he playing tournament golf but he was spending three and four hours of practice time. After which he would return to his hotel room and do a full routine of calisthenics with a set of bar bells he carries around with him. Stranahan is a weight lifter and a good one, but that's too strenuous a schedule.

Frank is the son of Robert Stranahan of the Champion Spark Plug Co. His father is intensely interested in golf and has encouraged Frank in his ambition to make his mark on the golf course. Frank is an amateur golfer. He was one of my pupils at the Inverness Golf Club in Toledo, but he is a much improved golfer after a year on the tour.

Stranahan is finally convinced that it is not necessary to drive the ball 300 yards every time he hits it. He realizes now that it is better to hit the ball only 250 yards and keep it on the fairways.

Frank is a big strong boy. He has plenty of distance off the tee, he is at his best with his iron clubs. He has a delicate touch around the greens.

Most of the professionals who have seen him play and were beaten by him in the open tournaments at Durham, N.C., and Kansas City, Mo., are convinced that he has the ability to win the title to support their opinion they point out that he came very close to winning the title in 1938 and 1941.
