THE CANADIAN MEAT INSPECTION SERVICE.

A bulletin from Dr. J. G. Rutherford, Veterinary Director General and Live Stock Commissioner, Ottawa, sets forth the importance of meat inspection and the limitations under which it is carried on.

Present day sentiment in Europe and America, especially since the revelations in the Chicago meat trade a few years ago, is arrayed very strongly against the use as human food of any meats save those duly inspected and certified by proper governmental authority.

There are now fifty large packing houses in Canada doing an export business whose establishments have come under the inspection of the federal department. There are at present employed in these departments 77 veterinary inspectors, all of whom have received a special training in meat inspection, and have passed a searching examination as to their qualifications.

Nor is this inspection made in vain. Last year as the result of this inspection 7,624 carcasses and 324,434 portions of carcasses were condemned as unfit for human food.

But for the inspection this diseased meat would have been sold and eaten as human food. What then is the proportion of diseased meat sold in the Provinces and municipalities of Canada, which passes no inspection at all? The inspection of meat for export is actually of no benefit to the home consumer but rather the reverse, as it tends to throw upon the local market some at least of the meats which would not pass inspection.

Dr. Rutherford is much impressed with these facts and argues strongly for the providing of municipal abattoirs to be conducted under methods of inspection similar to those provided for the export trade.

Dr. Rutherford proceeds to note that municipal abattoirs, like the modern hospitals, which have multiplied so rapidly within a generation, once tried will prove their great utility and benefit, and no community thus equipped would willingly return to the old order of things.

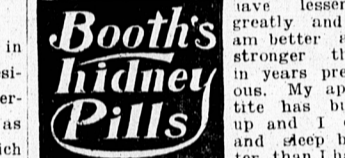
