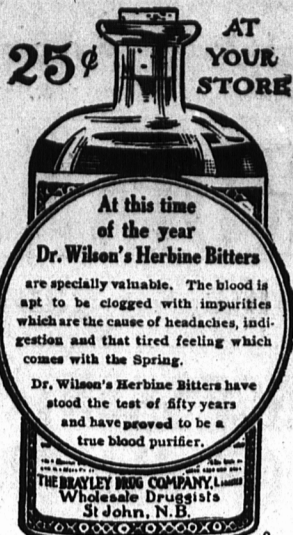

to be faithful to the trust reposed in me and to gather wisdom in this school of experience.

The absorbing thought in men's minds in these strenuous times is "Battle's magnificently stern array" along the various fronts and fittingly, indeed, it is referred to in the opening paragraphs of the Speech.
