Whereupon it behooveth all good citizens,

And be otherwise dealt with according to law
As in such cases made and provided.
Herein fall not.

THE RIGHT OF INTERVENTION.

The right of the United States to intervene in the affairs of Cuba at the present juncture is clear and explicit. It is of record that on handing over the government of the Island to the Cuban executive the latter accepted the terms of what is known as the Platt Amendment to the Cuban constitution which reads as follows:

That the government of Cuba consents that the United States may exercise the right to intervene for the preservation of Cuban independence, the maintenance of a government adequate for the protection of life, property and individual liberty and for discharging the obligations with respect to Cuba imposed by the treaty of Paris on the United States now to be assumed and undertaken by the government of Cuba.

The Palma government was no longer "adequate for the protection of life, property and individual liberty." Moreover, when armed revolution, with which the government of the Island was unable to cope, broke out, as it did recently the United States was as much bound as it was in the days of Spanish rule to inter-

vene and was further bound by the precedent of intervention then set, to now intervene, even were there no constitutional provision such as that above cited. The United States is responsible for Cuba, and it seems best for the Cubans and for the world that it is so.

THE SITUATION IN RUSSIA.

Matters in Russia appear more quiet outwardly, apart from the repeated assassinations. But doubtless there is great discontent even though it does not continue to show itself in extensive popular violence or armed insurrection. The low price of Russian securities in the home market do not indicate a general belief that the trouble is over. That famine exists in many provinces, even in those intersected by the Volga, is admitted, and here where under usual conditions there is a surplus of wheat, we are told that one fourth part of the people must be supplied with food.

The need cannot be supplied by local taxation and help must come from the imperial treasury. How long that treasury can stand the strain remains to be seen. And famine is of itself not only a pregnant cause of suffering, but of discontent as well. Other provinces, too which have been accustomed to draw their supplies from the valley of the Volga are feeling the pinch of scarcity. It will be a hard winter in Russia, with much suffering and probably troubles, whether armed revolution shall break out or not. Stern military repression and the rigor of the cold season may preserve a semblance of order but the smouldering fires of discontent will again burst forth at a future day.

An American provisional government has been formed in Cuba, with Secretary of War Taft proclaiming himself as Provisional Governor.
