HISTORY OF THE P. E. I. RAILWAY

On May 10, 1871, Mr. Boyd, Government Chief Engineer, came to the Island to superintend the work of the proposed Prince Edward Island Railway.

The contract price was \$13,845.00 per mile, and the surveying was left to the contractors on condition of touching specified points on the Island.

Three years was allowed in which to complete the whole road. But it appears that the work was pushed rapidly forward, for on July 8, 1872, Messrs. Newton and Meehan, Civil Engineers, New York, arrived in Charlottetown for the purpose of inspecting the work which was then well advanced.

Their general report received by the Executive Council on September 18, 1872, was in many respects unsatisfactory, principally on account of justifying the contractors for the 147 miles, instead of 120 as estimated by the preliminary survey.

After much hot contention between the interested parties, which many of the older citizens of the Island can remember, the Dominion Government assumed possession of the road on December 29, 1874.

On December 27, 1874, two trains were sent out to clear the track. The conductor Woods with two locomotives, snow plow, two coaches and two porters, was ordered to proceed to Georgetown, and about the same time Taylor with ten men and about the same equipment was ordered west.

The first day Woods only got as far as Royalty when he was obliged to return to Charlottetown, owing to ice and snow on the track. But the following day he pushed with three engines and a snow plow through the quarters of a mile of Mount Pleasant when his snow-plow and one of the engines left the track, smashing the snow-plow beyond repair.

After this the officials ceased their endeavors to open the road that winter, which was an exceptionally severe one, and the rolling stock was housed in Charlottetown until a more powerful power should clear the snow.

The rolling stock supplied by the contractors consisted of 14 locomotives, 14 first-class coaches, 9 second-class coaches, 14 baggage cars, five combined postal, smoking and express cars, 125 box cars, 43 flat cars, four snow plows and three flanges.

The first year the road was in operation, 33,964 passengers were carried.

Conductor Taylor was the first employee to meet death on the road, being killed the second year after it opened, between two cars of lumber. Conductor Archibald was killed a few years later, being struck on the head by the door of a box-car in road. It is dated January 4, 1875, and advertises three trains west and three east of Charlottetown, weekly, and the date on which the Government advertised the road would be opened for public traffic.

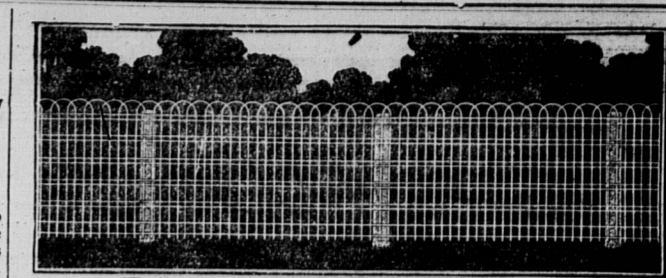
