Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Entry—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Entry—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock will not be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

CANNED LOBSTER

The welcome news for the Lobster dealers in these provinces announcing the withdrawal of the French Embargo against Canadian lobsters arrived at the end of the week, somewhat too late for its full benefit to be apparent during the present season. The bulk of the product has been sold and most of the goods exported before it became known. There will be an advantage no doubt to those buyers who have the goods on hand in England if the French trade draws its supply from those stocks before the Summer season is over so as to get them into consumption quickly and this will likely reflect upon our Canadian markets for another season.

The trade considers this credit as a victory for their contentions that lobster is a foodstuff and not a luxury and they believe it will render further arguments unnecessary as a nd dispel their fears as to any British prohibition being probable.

It is not the expectation of the trade that any material advances in current quotations for the article will occur, as the season's pack has been fully equal to the average of recent seasons and the cancelling of all licenses permitting shipments of Scandinavian countries recently reported will act as a deterrent to the likelihood of the demand overtaking the supply at the present time.

Some packers have the fear that with a continued increase in the case of canning supplies, that may be looked for if the present war continues through the next season, preparations for another season's campaign will have to be very cautiously made.

Latest reports from the only section now packing lobsters are quite favorable for a good supply, fully equal to that of recent seasons.— Maritime Merchants.

Major Prowse Reports Gr. Bourke Wounded

The following letter has been received by Mr. Patrick Bourke, Charlottetown, from Major W. B. Prowse, commanding 98th Canadian Siege Battery.— FRANCE

From O. C. 98th Canadian Siege Battery, B. E. France. To Mr. Patrick Bourke, Charlottetown, P. E. I., Canada. Dear Mr. Bourke:—

I am sorry to have to inform you that your son, 92887, Gunner Vernon Bourke, was wounded on the head on July 12th by a piece of shrapnel bullet which exploded in the battery position. He was just getting into a dug-out for safety, when the bullet hit him. The wound is not at all serious and I expect to have him back with me within a few weeks.
