AVIATOR LOST.—The many Island friends of Lieut. Jack Squires Buchanan, of 231 Huntington Ave., Boston, will be pained to hear that all hope for his safety has been abandoned. The plane he was flying was found forty miles out at sea wrecked. A letter from his mother to a friend in this city states: "On the 25th of April, his captain ordered him to fly over a Boston parade." The wind was blowing 45 miles an hour and engine trouble developed while returning to the Naval Station at Chatham. Lieut. Buchanan was only 23 years of age, a young man of an exceptionally fine character. His loss is doubly sad as he went with the first Americans to France, coming through the war without a scratch. His mother spent last summer on the Island, and had planned to come back on an auto trip with her son this season. While in the city she was the guest of her cousin, Mr. W. P. Doull.
