Foley of Charlottetown Distinguished Himself at Kingston.

Mr. Brent Foley who is at present a student of Owen's University, Kingston, Ont., is again distinguishing himself on the football field.

At the Rochedale grounds, before 10,000 spectators H. Cullum (champion of Wales) defeated E. C. Bredin (champion of the World) in a half mile running race for the Championship of the World and one thousand dollar purse.

Bart M. Duffy with his manager, F. J. Fields of St. John, N. B., the speedy ice skater, is at present in Boston.

Major Taylor, the colored cyclist, left Chicago after having reduced the mile, third-mile, and half-mile records.

The racing yacht Shamrock is being dismantled at Greenock. She was towed most of the way, and only sailed under her own canvas 230 miles.

Boston Herald says:—Efforts are being made to bring about a match race between Tom Butler and Taylor, to be ridden indoors.

Edouard Taylore, the French rider, is on his way to New York. He is coming mainly to get a match race with Harry Elkes.

Watson Coleman, the five-mile national champion is living in Three Rivers, just out side of Palmer. He may decide to go to Paris.

Maj. Taylor says he will get the mile record down to 1:10 next year. He has given up record work for the season and returned to Worcester.

LIZZIE BORDEN

Her Strange Actions and the Alleged

NEW EVIDENCE FOUND

Detectives Are Said to Have Opened an Office—The Case in Hand.

BOSTON, Mass., Nov. 20.—When asked concerning the rumor that new evidence had been found in the Lizzie Borden case and that there was a probability of the reopening of the case, Attorney General Knowlton tonight said:—

"I don't know anything about it. But I will say one thing further, the case could not be reopened, no matter what new evidence might be found."

Montreal, Que., Nov. 20.—The rumor that Lizzie Borden has been in hiding in this city since Friday was set in motion by an order from a New York paper to its correspondent here, who was told to hunt her up, as new evidence had been found in the Borden case which would enable the authorities to try her for the murder of her father.

The despatch intimated that she had fled from Fall River, Mass., and that in New York she and her companion, a man with gray hair, had taken tickets for Montreal and that they should have

arrived here on Friday morning. No trace of such persons has been found here this far.
