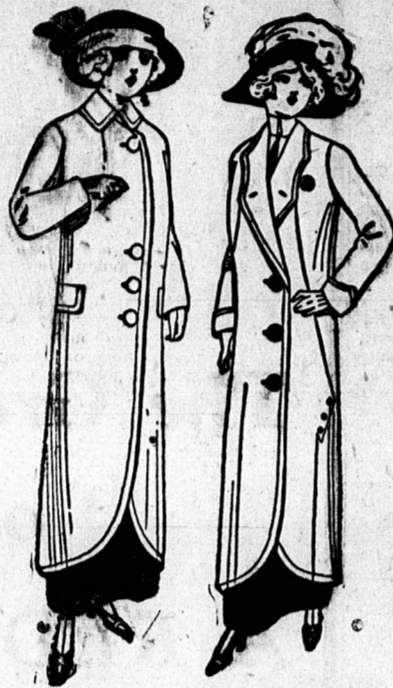

MAINE TO SPEND \$2,000,000 ON HER ROADS

BANGOR, Me., November 19--In order to serve the touring public next season and the auto-tourists of Maine and New Brunswick the Bangor Chamber of Commerce, through its secretary, W. A. Hennessey, is endeavoring to arrange with the Board of Trade of St. John for a co-operative plan of giving out road information that will be of mutual benefit to both sections, and also to the hundreds of auto-tourists that come to both Maine and New Brunswick each summer.

Secretary Hennessey has written to Henry T. Hoag, the secretary of the St. John Board of Trade, asking for his aid in this matter.

In turn Secretary Hennessey intends to furnish the St. John organization with any information regarding the Maine roads that is available and the joint information according to his plan, will be kept on file both in Bangor and St. John for the benefit of the motorists. Maine has awakened to the importance of the summer automobile and tourist business and beginning next spring will commence the expenditure of \$2,000,000 upon its roads and highways. This money was raised by a special bond issue, authorized by the state legislature, the interest upon which is paid from the revenue received in licensing automobile owners. While it will take a great deal more than \$2,000,000 to place Maine's roads on the same plane with those of some of the other states of the union, it is a good start in the right direction that will arouse the citi-

zens in the cities and towns to increased efforts on their own behalf.

Speaking of the plans for bringing Maine and New Brunswick closer together for the benefit of its automobile owners, Secretary Hennessey says: "We have come to realize in this part of Maine that the summer tourist means money to the community which he visits, and we endeavor to make his visit to Bangor as pleasant as any on his route.

"We have found that a great many tourists that come this far east wish to continue their trip to New Brunswick, and are looking for information concerning the roads and conditions there. For this reason we hope to arrange with the St. John Board of Trade for an interchange of information that will be valuable to both Bangor and St. John. I feel sure that Secretary Hoag will stand ready to assist in this work. The closer relationship between the two cities will be of mutual advantage."
