LONGBOAT AFTER WORLD'S RECORD

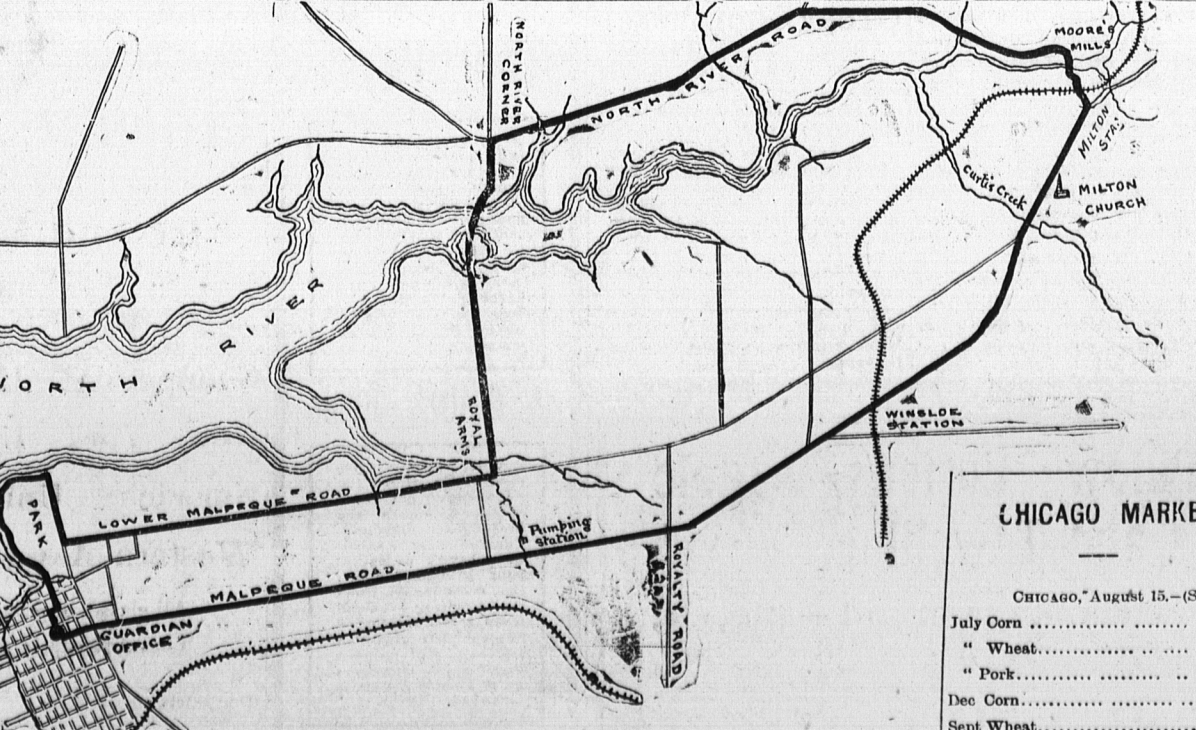
