NEW YORK, April 29—The will of Peter Fenelon Collier, the publisher filed for probate today, after making various bequests, provides that the residue of the testator's estate, the total value of which is estimated at from \$4,000,000 to \$5,000,000, shall go to his son, Robert J. Collier, with the provision that should his son die without issue the amount so bequeathed shall go for the establishment of a non-sectarian orphanage in Montmouth County (N. J.). An annual income of \$40,000 is provided for the widow.

NAIROBI, British East Africa, April 29—Mr. Roosevelt had a fair day's sport at the ranch of Sir Alfred Pease, on the Athi River, Thursday. In twenty-four hours he killed 18 head of mixed buck, including two other animals.

REPORT OF CASTRO' GOLD

CARACAS, Venezuela, April 29—It is persistently reported here that Cipriano Castro left a fortune in gold buried in Caracas. If this is so it explains Castro's lack of funds and his anxiety to get back to Venezuela. Negotiations have been begun between the Venezuelan Government and a representative of the Ethelburga syndicate of London for a settlement of the disputes over the match and salt monopolies in Venezuela held until recently by English companies. The newspapers and the public generally condemn the suggestion to remove the thirty per cent. differential duty on goods coming into Venezuela from the West Indies.

HEART DISEASE HEADS FRISCO DEATH LIST

SACRAMENTO, Cal., April 29—Heart disease was the principal cause of death in San Francisco during 1908, while in Los Angeles tuberculosis was the most fatal malady of the year, according to statistics announced recently by the state Board of Health.
 Tuberculosis and lung troubles caused 1,179 of Los Angeles' 6,011 deaths while deaths from heart disease numbered 837.
 The leading epidemic in both cities was typhoid fever, 81 deaths resulting from it in San Francisco and 83 in Los Angeles.

COSTS DOCTORS \$2500 TO PRESCRIBE WHISKY

MARIETTA, Ohio, April 29—Dr. Lee Warren, of this city, was convicted before Mayor McKinney of writing liquor prescriptions for beverage purpose in a dry county. He was convicted on five counts, and was fined \$500 on each count.
 Warren was caught by a special detective of the Ohio Anti-Saloon League. This is the first case of the kind since Washington county voted dry under the Rose law, two months ago.

PAID BIG FIGURE.

NEW YORK, April 29—The American Sugar Refining Company, of New Jersey, and the New York corporation of the same name today paid into the United States Treasury about nine hundred thousand dollars, completing a payment of approximately two million dollars in settlement of fines and claims, made by the Government in its recent charges of fraud on the part of the Sugar Company.
