St. John's Nfld., Telegram.—A shrewd business man of Water Street said yesterday that he thought there would be a small decline in the price of fish within a week or two, and that fish purchasers here were not voluntarily paying a high price for fish, but were doing so to keep their rivals at Halifax out of the market and because they wanted the fish themselves. It is our opinion that, with the demand for fish increasing yearly, and the opening up of new markets, and the ratification of the treaty for reciprocal trade with the United States of America and improvement in the cure of fish, there ought to be no difficulty in keeping the price within the neighbourhood of five dollars per quintal.

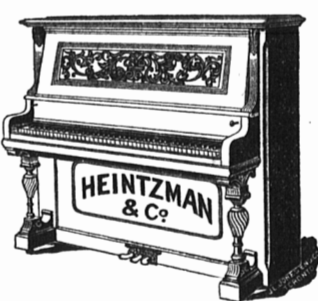
