THE CARE OF YOUR CAR

Driving a car down a steep grade when the road is very muddy, is hazardous under best working conditions—a number of accidents have been caused through just this. The front wheels are inclined to skid to one side or the other, if the brake is applied the rear will skid, and there seems to be to the driver, no way to control the car effectively.

A great amount of danger can be eliminated and greater control of the car maintained by putting the car in second gear, when it will be found that a steady momentum of the car will be retained and the use of the brakes unnecessary, unless it is to come to a stop when very light pressure will accomplish the desired effect.

The wisest plan is to engage into second gear at the very top of the grade, but go down in second gear very slowly.

In case of a skid, do not depress the clutch; rather apply the brake very little and do not accelerate the motor, then if anything happens if you have been unable to control the car, one thing that will save everything to the greatest extent is the fact that you were going slowly.

Answer—The car of which you speak has gray iron sleeves inserted into a soft metal block which obviates the necessity of re-boring. When any abnormal wear takes place the sleeves are taken from the block proper and new sleeves and pistons inserted.

**Plot is Unearthed TO SMUGGLE CHINESE**

VICTORIA, B. C., Oct. 16.—What is believed to be an international plot to land large numbers of Chinese in Canada, contrary to the immigration law, was revealed here last night when the Canadian Government took steps to imprison and later deport a dozen Chinese charged with attempting to enter this country on forged and fraudulent certificates of entry.
