THE funeral of the late Mrs. Theo. D. Crosby, West River, took place on Sunday afternoon to the family cemetery. The pall bearers were three sons and three nephews. The daughters are Mrs. Mary Roper, Boston, and Miss Hannah at home.

It is expected that dredging in connection with the Hillsboro Bridge will be commenced in a day or two. In conversation with Mr. Butler yesterday evening THE GUARDIAN learns that everything is progressing favorably and that a number of caissons will be placed this year. The one under construction has reached its 11th course and is certainly strongly constructed and stayed. A visit to the pier will give some idea of the way the work is being carried on. The planning mill is operated in the evenings until the shades of evening compel it to shut down.

THE Ottawa Evening Journal says:—Mr. George Irving, of Prince Edward Island who is to take Rev. Dr. Rose's place during the summer, arrived in town last night and will occupy the pulpit of Dominion Methodist church to-morrow. Mr. Irving returned recently from Northfield, where he has been attending the sixteenth annual students conference of the Young Men's Christian Associations of the Eastern States and Canada. Mr. Irving says that the Conference was particularly interesting this year on account of the presence of many of the delegates to the Young Men's Christian Association Jubilee in Boston, fifteen councils being represented. There were about 600 delegates in all and forty Canadians, representing all the leading colleges of the Dominion. Mr. Irving was in the McGill delegation and is president of the Young Men's Christian Association of that university. The conference was held during the recent hot spell and the thermometer stood at 100 nearly every day, but this did not interfere with the work. It also included the Fourth of July and the Canadians assisted in the celebration by singing "Rule Britannia," and carrying a plaster of paris lion, almost life size, into the assembly. Mr. Irving intends giving some talks during the summer on the work of the Students' Young Men's Christian Association.

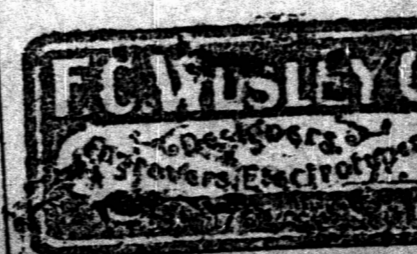

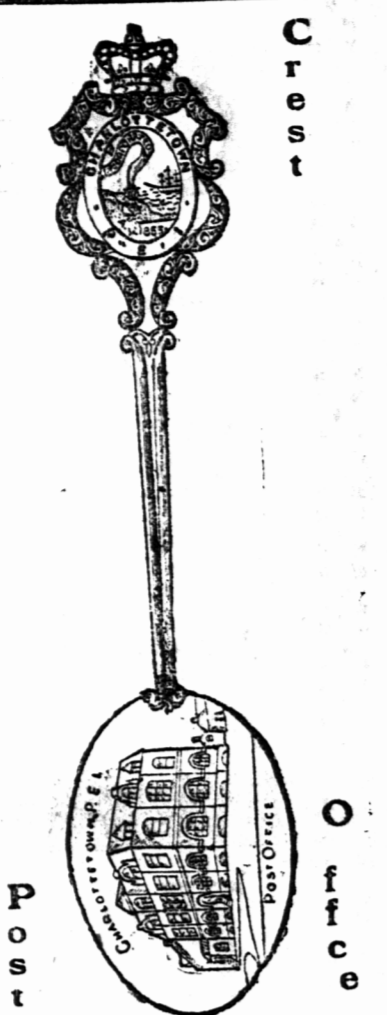
