supplies is to be expected. Evidence of expansion were apparent before the latest announcement and it will be no surprise if the highest hog production in the history of this province may be achieved during the next eighteen months.

The Province suffered a serious loss during the year in the death of Mr. S.D. Irvine of the Federal Sheep and Swine Division. Mr. Irvine was an outstanding and energetic citizen, and his livestock promotion and his splendid leadership in his particular field will be hard to replace.

Poultry

The Poultry Industry continues to occupy the spotlight in Provincial farm production. In no other department has greater progress been recorded. Through progressive policies, coordinated between the Provincial and Federal Departments of Agriculture, producers and distributor agencies remarkable advancement in general all round improvement has taken place.

The general condition of flocks built up from Island hatchery chicks fully reflect these drastic provisions. In 1946, 136,285 old chicks were distributed from Island hatcheries as compared with 47,866 in 1945.

Price Support During the latter part of the year representations were made to the Prices Support Board to support the price of potatoes during the present season and as a result an assistance has been made to the Spring months. Negotiations are still going on by provincial agricultural leaders in the interests of our potato producers.

Marked Progress A great advancement has also taken place in a general way in housing and nutritional practices and poultrymen generally during the year have made such additions in most cases as labour and material would permit.

STRONG LIQUID POSITION DEPOSITS, LOANS AND PROFITS HIGHER

The fiscal year ended November 30th, 1946, has been a progressive year for The Provincial Bank of Canada, as shown by the statement just published.

There has been an appreciable increase in loans as well as in deposits, and total assets stood at \$141,857,913 compared with \$132,809,222 in 1945.

Profits for the year were \$506,282 as against \$476,620 the previous year. Federal taxes, in the amount of \$161,738 were \$13,600 higher.

Amortization provided for bank premises was \$98,282. Dividends paid to shareholders amounted to \$210,000, representing three quarterly dividends at the rate of 5 p.c. and 8 p.c. for the last quarter.

After making the above deductions there remained a sum of \$32,283 to be added to surplus account, which stood at \$306,629 on November 30th, 1946.

A sum of \$1,000,000 transferred to inner reserve from 1932 to 1939 inclusively, for possible contingencies, was not used and was restored to reserve fund in 1946.

Cash on hand and deposits with the Bank of Canada and other banks, totalled \$19,737,558. Other readily realizable assets, consisting of bonds of the Dominion Government, provinces and municipalities and shares, amounted to \$37,841,914.

Call loans, fully guaranteed by securities, were in the amount of \$6,142,235.

Quick realizable assets totalled \$113,721,908 corresponding to 84 per cent of liabilities to the public.

Interest bearing deposits at \$110,827,729 show an increase of \$14,916,369 over the previous year.

Public deposits not bearing interest standing at \$26,137,773 remained about the same level. Balance carried by the Dominion Government in the amount of \$7,118,011 had decreased by \$7,027,110.

Such wide variations are always subject to daily fluctuations in all the banks in 1946. Call loans at \$6,142,235 have receded by approximately \$3,500,000.

However, loans to industry, commerce, agriculture, municipalities and school boards have increased from \$17,875,329 to \$25,503,908.

The published statement indicates very satisfactory progress and higher profits than the previous year.
