TO FIND THE NORTH POLE

Just at the close of the year the editor of a great Chicago newspaper, The Times Herald gave a notable assignment to the Washington correspondent of that journal. It was in the following words: "Walter Wellman, Washington: Build an airship, go find the north pole and report by wireless telegraphy and submarine cables the progress of your efforts. (Signed) Frank B. Noyes."

Mr. Wellman promptly accepted the commission, and ordered the airship by cable to Paris where it will be built under the supervision of Santos Dumont. When built the airship will be tested in Paris, then transported to Norway, and about July next it is expected that Mr. Wellman will soar northward from Spitzbergen in search of the pole. It is intended to have constructed the largest practicable airship yet built, 190 feet long and 49 feet in diameter, with a capacity to carry four tons weight of crew and cargo. It will be propelled by three motors aggregating 70 horse power. Barring adverse winds it is calculated to make the passage from Spitzbergen to the pole in 45 hours. How very easy all this is—on paper.

ONTARIO'S MINERALS.

The Ontario Bureau of Mines is a branch of the Department of Crown Lands and the annual report of this branch covers 374 pages. The mineral resources of the Province are varied and valuable. Metallic products to the value of \$3,156,677 were produced in 1904, giving employment to 3,017 men whose wages amounted to \$1,334,367. Gold, silver, platinum, zinc, cobalt, nickel, copper and iron are among these products. Non-metallic minerals to the value of \$6,665,970 were also produced, giving employment to 7,474 hands and an outlay of \$2,503,816 for wages. The total production of metallic and non-metallic substances was valued at over eleven and a half millions and gave employment to 10,491 hands. Bricks, tiles, building stone, cement, lime, petroleum, salt, natural gas, carbide calcium, corundum and peat fuel are among the larger items of non-metallic mineral production. The total mineral production of the Province shows a gain of over \$2,000,000 since 1900 while the metallic production has doubled in value during that time.

The defeat of Rufus Pope, Conservative, admittedly a strong man, in the by-election in Compton, Quebec, gives little indication of change in electoral opinion. Mr. Hunt's majority at the last general election was 295, and is now something over 300.

Alderman Dan Gallery, Liberal M. P. for St. Anne, Montreal, who has now been unseated and disqualified by the court had a majority of 731 at the general election. He might easily have been honestly elected as the Liberal majority in the division is large. He is justly punished with the severest penalty of the law which he appears to have flagrantly violated.

Montreal City Council has reorganized its law department by the appointment of additional lawyers, raising the number from three to eight and the total for legal salaries from \$10,500 to \$30,500 yearly. All are members of the French Canadian bar but one. The Witness protests strenuously against the extravagance, nepotism and racial exclusiveness shown in the arrangement. Two of the newly appointed civic counsel were only admitted to the bar in 1904 and 1905 respectively.

The Russian forces in Manchuria at the close of the war now appear to have been more numerous than was generally believed. The Novoe Vremya, one of the most reliable St. Petersburg journals, states that General Linievitch had under his command 12,500 officers, 917,000 men and 270,000 horses. The whole number taken to Manchuria was over 20,000 officers, 1,270,000 men and 230,000 horses. Allowing for the number of Russian troops in Manchuria when the war broke out, it appears that the Russian losses were 7,500 officers and 433,000 men.
