THE SHORT ATLANTIC FERRY.

Many persons have a sort of confidence in the Newfoundland route for the fast Atlantic service. It was in fact advocated many years ago by some influential persons, before and after the railway across Newfoundland was constructed.

Sir Robert Bond when in Montreal a few days ago brought the matter up again, advocating a route from Galway or Liverpool to a port on the east coast of Newfoundland, thence across Newfoundland by rail and by steamer to Cape Breton.

A certified check for 5 per cent of amount of contract must accompany each tender which will be forfeited should the tenderer fail to enter into good and sufficient bonds for completion of contract.

Assuming that this route were adopted and fast steamers put on, the main ocean voyage would be reduced to 44 hours, with, say, four hours more between Port aux Basques, N. F. and Aspy Bay, C. B. and the entire time spent on the water would be but 48 hours.

and Newfoundland one steamship would do the work of two between Liverpool and New York. The danger of collisions would also be greatly reduced by the fact that the "short ferry" would be out of the way of the greater part of the trans-atlantic traffic.

The Halifax Chronicle ventures that the prevalence of youthful vice and crime may be partly due to the increase of female teachers and decrease of male teachers in our schools, arguing that boys are not sufficiently controlled by the "weak and raw girls" who are often employed to teach because their services can be secured at a low rate.

Rev. M. R. Grant of Trenton, N. S., is not only a fearless advocate of prohibition but also takes a vigorous part in enforcing the Scott Act in that region. He publishes a bright journal called The Truth, the last issue of which contains the following offer of a reward for evidence against illegal liquor sellers:

A reward of \$25 is hereby offered to any person who will furnish evidence which will lead to a conviction for violation of the Scott Act in New Glasgow or Stellarton. The name of the informant will be kept in confidence. Apply to the Editor of the Truth.

DOMINION COAL OUTPUT.

GLACE BAY, September 2.—The August output of the Dominion Coal Company amounted to 288,238 tons, divided as follows, among the various collieries:
