

ENQUIRY INTO THE VALUE OF GOODS SUPPLIED TO THE GOVERNMENT.

The Medical Times, London comments on an enquiry made with the object of ascertaining whether a certain extract of beef (BOVRIL) supplied to the Government had any nutritive value or not and after a lengthy description of the exhaustive tests says, "The results were startling. It was found that in all cases the administration of the extract 'BOVRIL' caused an immediate increase in weight".

In subject C (human) it was found that after the use of 10 grams of Bovril the mean increase in weight was 129 grams, whilst in subject S (human) the mean increase after the use of 10 grams of the same extract was no less than 216 grams".

There were two separate series of tests, one consisted in experiments on dogs the other on human beings and the Medical Times continues, "In each of the experiments on dogs it was found that the actual increase in weight varied from 10 to 20 times the weight of the dried solids added to the food in the form of Bovril, whilst in the human experiments the increase was even more marked".

WHERE OLD NEWSPAPERS GO.

OTTAWA, Sept. 23.—W. J. Egan, Canadian trade commissioner in Manchester, has discovered where the old newspapers go. He says in a report in the weekly report of the department of trade and commerce, "Having noticed during frequent visits to the Manchester docks many bundles of old papers, enquiries were made in reference to the use of same, and the information furnished was that Manchester was the principal center in the old country for the collection of old newspapers. These newspapers are sorted and shipped principally to Indian ports, but China has now entered into the trade and last year she imported 4,211,872 pounds of old newspapers valued at £14,227. Those newspapers are used in many districts of China, particularly New Chang, as wall paper for native houses and cottages."

BOY WAS SHOT.

HALIFAX, Sept. 24.—Oecil Power, aged thirteen, son of Harry Power, Dartmouth, was the victim of a shooting accident Sunday afternoon on the Waverley Road when a bullet from the rifle of Arthur Boland entered his cheek, close to the nose, and seriously injured him.

The regrettable affair was purely accidental. Boland was shooting at a tree, and Power attempting to get away ran in front of the rifle and was consequently struck by the bullet. The rifle was of 22 calibre.

Mr. Simon wins first place on the \$10,000 besides commission, which ultimately will reach \$100,000. The remaining four competitors get \$2,000.

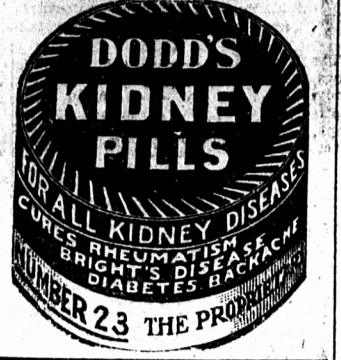
DISCHARGE OF I. C. R. EMPLOYEES.
