MR. HAROLD C. CROSS LEAVING SHORTLY FOR THE FRONT

At a special meeting of the Board of Directors of the Y. M. C. A. on Tuesday evening last Mr. Harold Cross feeling the responsibility of his own personal actions in connection with the call of young men for the front decided to tender his resignation with the Y. M. C. A. work of this city.

Mr. Cross stated that he had at first intended joining the regular militia as a soldier but Y. M. C. A. directors realizing his great ability in reaching young men in a spiritual way have influenced him to join the Y. M. C. A. staff for overseas service on the firing line.

The directors and many citizens of the city will regret losing Mr. Cross' services among the young people of all denominations.

It might of interest to the general public to know first hand what Mr. Cross has been able to do since coming here about one year ago. A half hour gymnasium classes there were 613 in attendance during the month of November. There are two Basket Ball leagues now running, weekly, several Bible Study groups the juniors, students and soldiers, meeting weekly and the Sunday morning service at ten o'clock for students is well attended. Some sixty boys members of various churches, are enrolled with the Boy Scouts, membership in the Y. M. C. A. not being required for this movement. Mr. Cross has also, in co-operation with others, been teaching or training Sunday School teachers on the Sunday School lesson once a week. Besides the various duties in connection with his association work Mr. Cross has found time to assist in other branches of good work among the groups of young people attending other churches in this city.

The financial side of the Association has been one of strenuousness, especially during war time and yet notwithstanding these conditions some \$600 has been paid for outstanding bills, besides paying current expenses. There is however a heavy loan which the directors hope sometime, along with the citizens, to reduce, in order to place the institution on a sound financial basis.

The directors in consideration of Mr. Cross' excellent work thought it best not to accept his resignation but decided to give him a year's leave of absence with the hope that he would

Mr. Cross expects to leave within the next ten days for Halifax to report at Headquarters and in the next few weeks will be on his way to the front.

It is hard to part with men of Mr. Cross' influence but his fellow workers do so gladly in the face of a great and larger work among those who are fighting our battles bravely for civil and religious liberty.

Mr. Cross' host of friends will no doubt wish him God's Blessing and a safe return to Charlottetown.

PRINCESS PATS NOW ACTING AS INSTRUCTIONAL UNIT

The following clipping from a Montreal newspaper will be of deep interest in this province as there are several young men from here still with the Princess Pats. Among those known to the sender are:— Ptes. George Marchbanks and George Bowness of Mount Rose; Charles Buxton, Cape Traverse, Fred White, Alberton; Joseph Monaghan, Kinkora; A. Lietat, McLean and Private Ronaghan of Kinkora. Three of the above, White, Monaghan and Ronaghan have been through all the trials undergone by the Pats each escaping without serious injury.

MONTREAL, December 13.—The P. C. L. I., are still winning signal honors at the front, so much so that they have now been detailed to act in an instructional capacity to a large number of young British subalterns and N.C.O.'s. This information is contained in an interesting letter from Captain George McDonald, who had a commission with the 3rd Universities Contingent, that left some time ago as reinforcements for the Princess Pats, and has evidently been with them for some time.

Capt. McDonald's letter is dated from France, November 10, and is, in part, as follows: "On Monday we had a delightful march of about ten miles to this village, or rather town, for it is much larger than any of the other places in which have been billeted.

"Before leaving in the morning we

were reviewed by General Smith, Brigadier of the 80th Brigade, to which we were saying farewell. He made a good address and spoke very highly of the P.P.C.L.I. Gault replied, speaking very well indeed. The regiment has been in that brigade for nine months, and is most popular with the other battalions, and very highly thought of by the O.C.I. was detailed to carry the flag on this occasion. This occasioned standing or marching at attention for 1 1/2 hours, with a squad of three sergeants with fixed bayonets. When the men saw me come on parade they thought I was under arrest. They tell me that the P.P.C.L.I., is the only battalion in the army which is carrying its colors to the field.

"We have now been paid the signal honor of being attached to the 36th Division as instructional battalion. I understand this entails our being used during the next ten weeks for the instruction of between one and two hundred young subalterns and N.C.O.'s.

"I am billeted over a butcher shop. Fortunately it is small and clean and they carry little stock on hand. I have a very comfortable room and go in for the luxury of a bath every morning. Today the men of our company are having baths in the baths of a nearby factory. They are billeted in a music hall, which has encouraged them to give a concert.

"I have just been practicing my French for Madame Futeher. She is short and stout and possessed of a very quiet gentle voice, much appreciated after the terrible noise of our last billet. Madame has had all

kinds of French to entertain during the year, French, Italian, Spanish, Turkish, Algerian, English, and now Canadians. There have also been Canadians in the town. We shall probably be here for several weeks and the officers all agree that it is the best billet we have had yet."
