### EXHIBITION FARES TO ST. JOHN, N. B.

P. E. Island Railway Rates Extremely Low and Attractive.

In this issue is printed a large advertisement from the offices of the Dominion Exhibition, St. John, N. B., quoting transportation rates from the various points along the P. E. Island Railway to the bustling New Brunswick centre during the national fair, September 5 to 15 next. As will be noticed by the list the railway people have made most generous concessions which will undoubtedly assure a record-breaking exodus from the Island on the dates mentioned. There will be two classes of fares, one to be issued from September 3rd to 14th and to remain good for return until the 16th. The other gives a stated number of days for departure and a stated number of days for return. This latter plan allows of making the rate remarkably low, indeed. The St. John Exhibition Executive have closed all the details of the big show and energetic exhibitors from all sections of the continent are already at work erecting their display booths. ### SHOOTING AT OTTAWA.

OTTAWA, Aug. 16—The Ottawa Batteries won first and second places in the Field Batteries' Efficiency competition this year by large margins.

The Second Battery led with 650 points and the 23rd Battery was next with 627 points.

The nearest competitor had only 577 points. The complete results have not yet been announced. (It might be here mentioned that this is not the competition that P. E. Island competed in, that being the heavy battery, the results of which have not yet been announced, but as soon as received will be published in The Guardian.)

OTTAWA, Aug. 16—News has reached the Archbishop's Palace of the cure of Miss Alice Cote of St. Patrick Street of Immaculate, at the shrine at Ste. Anne de Beaupre. Miss Cote suffered for years of an illness which deprived her almost entirely of the use of one limb, necessitating the employment of crutches.

### MURDERERS ESCAPE FROM ASYLUM.

HAMILTON, Ont., Aug. 16—Private Moir and Robert Frederick Taggart, both murderers, escaped from the Asylum here by sawing through the iron bars of the windows of their rooms. Both men had assistance.

### FIFTH EARL OF SPENCER DEAD IN LONDON.

LONDON, Aug. 14—J. Poyntz Spencer, the fifth Earl of Spencer, died here yesterday. He was born in 1835. The earl twice held the posts of viceroy of Ireland and president of the council and was first lord of the admiralty from 1893 to 1895.

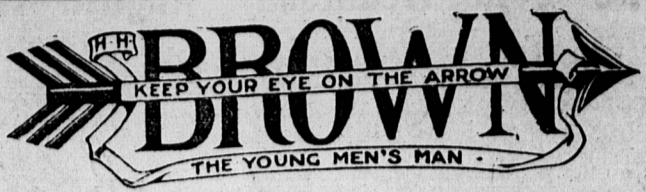
### RESULT OF BRUSSELS FIRE.
